

6th Grade Core Class Grading Policies

Hello 6th grade families! Each subject in the 6th grade has a slightly different grading policy based on the needs of that area of study. Please see all the grading policies listed below.

Grade Category Distribution for ALL Subjects

70% daily grades - classwork and homework

30% major grades - tests and projects

Humanities Late Work: ELA and World Cultures

- **How long do I have to turn in work?** Three weeks past the due date, assignments will close and cannot be turned in. The only situation in which assignments can be turned in past the three week due date is with teacher approval at after-school or before-school tutorials.
- **How many late points will be deducted:** Teachers will take a one-time deduction of 10 points from any assignments turned in past the due date posted on Google Classroom. If your child receives extra time, the points will be deducted if the assignment is turned in past the due date and the extra time allowance.

Math Late Work:

As math concepts build quickly in middle school, it is important that your child keeps up to date with their math assignments. The math late work policy reflects this, encouraging students to stay as current on their math work as possible.

- **How long do I have to turn in the work?** Homework and classwork may be turned in up to 3 days after the due date for credit. After three days, the assignment may no longer be accepted for credit unless there are extenuating circumstances.
- **Grade Deductions for Late Work:**
 - 1 day late - up to 80% credit can be earned
 - 2 days late - up to 70% credit can be earned
 - 3 days late - up to 60% credit can be earned
 - More than three days - no credit unless approved reason (illness, emergency, IEP/504 plan)

Science Late Work:

- **How long do I have to turn in work?** Science assignments stay open until the end of the grading period.
- **How many late points will be deducted:** Science does not deduct points from late work.

What if my child was absent?

Students still need to complete the work from class even if they are absent by the deadlines stated above. The assignments are posted on Google classroom and available in the teacher's room. However, we encourage communication! If there is an extenuating circumstance such as illness or family emergency, please let the teacher of record know.
