- I expect students to be leaders at school. I tell them I expect their best effort each day. I set a very nurturing, respectful tone in my classroom, yet I create a lot of structure and have high expectations of students.
- Our classroom expectations:

  - Follow directions and routines
  - Listen when someone is talking, no side conversations
- Lastly, we have class jobs that students LOVE. It helps students learn about responsibility and helping to take care of our space together.
- Students work together to earn stars as a class, which translates into minutes for a Fun Friday each week. Students vote on the class selected activity- outside play, board game day, wear pjs, etc. We reflect after each lesson if we met our classroom expectations.
- Individual behavior concerns are addressed on a case by case basis.
