2025-26 PROGRAM GUIDANCE

APPLICATION & ACCEPTANCE

All students must apply online: www.lrsd.org/lpn no later than November 21, 2025 Online application will open November 3, 2025 and will require students to upload transcript and test scores.

To apply, students must meet the following criteria:

- Minimum 2.5 GPA
- ACT Reading score of 19 or Accuplacer Next Gen Reading score of 256.

Only Rising juniors may apply.

Students will be notified of acceptance December 15, 2025. Students must formally accept no later than December 19, 2025. **School counselors will be notified January 5, 2026.**

ACCUPLACER

Since many sophomores have not yet taken the ACT test, students will most likely need the opportunity to take the Accuplacer Next Generation exam. If your school does not have a Career Coach (who can administer Accuplacer), please contact xerlotta.jones@lrsd.org or call 501-447-1395.

COURSE CODES

DUAL CREDIT

As part of Pre-LPN Summer Internship, students will take Anatomy & Physiology I with lab (4.0 credits) and Anatomy & Physiology II with lab (4.0 credits) for dual credit through ASU Beebe. One course can count as dual enrollment for a third science course to satisfy SMART Core requirements. The other course can count as an elective.

Students should follow their district's policies concerning transcripting credit for dual enrollment.

ACADEMIC ADVISING

Students completing coursework, clinicals, and earning a passing score to become a Licensed Practical Nurse (LPN) can continue their post-secondary education on an accelerated tract to become a Registered Nurse (RN). Students desiring to do so should take AP or concurrent courses for **College Algebra** and **Composition I**, required prerequisites to the BHCLR Accelerated Nursing Track. Students would also benefit from gaining college credit for any of the following courses, which are required to complete the BHCLR Accelerated Nursing Track:

- 1. Chemistry with Lab (4 hours)
- 2. Composition II (3 hours)
- 3. Sociology (3 hours)
- 4. Psychology (3 hours)
- 5. Microbiology with Lab (4 hours)
