Fay would like to expand our science department to include Botany (2000370) and Ecology (2000380) courses that will prepare graduates for careers in ecological sciences while earning wetland delineation certification. This training creates a skilled workforce essential to Florida's rapidly growing construction and development economy. Walton County ranks as Florida's fastest growing local economy, with construction as the second largest employment sector. This rapid growth creates significant demand for qualified environmental professionals. Florida has lost more than 50 percent (9 million acres) of its natural wetlands in the past 200 years, making wetland assessment and regulatory compliance critical for all development projects. Through this expansion our students will become qualified to conduct federally-mandated environmental assessments under the Clean Water Act, positioning them for careers with environmental consulting firms, regulatory agencies, engineering companies, and land development firms throughout the rapidly developing Northwest Florida region. The specialized skill set commands competitive salaries in the growing environmental compliance sector, with particular opportunities in coastal communities where development pressure is highest.

Seeking a grant to support Annette's ROV club - remote operated vehicle (underwater). photogrammetry developing a database using sensors and cameras analyzing information and providing reports to the science team. The club will create a digital 3-D library of the Underwater Museum of Arts off of Grayton Beach (one of 3 in the world). In addition, they will work with CBA on photogrammetry of the oyster beds.
