The topic to be covered in the manuscript should be made explicit in the beginning. Prior to the goal, authors should give a sufficient background and a brief review of the literature to document the current situation, highlight the best prior research,

highlight the primary limitations of prior research, outline your goals (to address the limitation), and highlight the manuscript's scientific merit or novelties. The author or authors should conclude the paragraph by discussing the importance of identifying the problem and the research's goal.

The manuscript written by the author whose English is the second language needs to be proofread. Ignoring this requirement results in the rejection of the manuscript. For this part to reference, please use Garamond, 12, with 1.15 spaces. The Articles section must have a length of 4000-6000 words with a minimum of 25 references and 50 bodynotes (each of them 80% from journal articles).

METHOD

The method is optional for original research articles. This method is written in descriptive form and should provide a statement regarding the methodology of the research. This method is as much as possible to give an idea to the reader.

RESULTS AND DISCUSSION

The most crucial part of your article is this one. The research's findings or analysis should be succinct and easy to understand. Instead of offering data in great detail, the results should provide a summary of (scientific) findings. Please indicate how your findings or results differ from those of other researchers' earlier publications.

For direct citation when it is more than four lines you need to write it in 10 pt with single space:

The description in the conclusion should address the issue or issues brought up as well as the goals of the study. Give a succinct and understandable conclusion. Avoid restating the abstract or merely summarizing the study's findings. Provide a concise explanation of the potential use and/or recommendations pertaining to the research findings.

ACKNOWLEDGMENTS

Give credit to those who assisted with the research, particularly the person who provided financing for it. Add those who have helped you with your studies, such as advisors, financial backers, or other supporters like proofreaders, typewriters, and suppliers who may have provided materials.

REFERENCES

References at the end of the manuscript should be written in APA (*American Psychological Association*) Citation Style in the body notes and references. All

works that are cited in the text should be stated on the References and vice versa. Please use Reference Manager Applications like Mendeley, Zotero, EndNote, etc. Use other published articles in the same journal as models. All publications cited in the text should be included as a list of Bibliography, arranged alphabetically by author.

The writing of references is not separated such as books, journal articles, conference papers. References are sorted by alphabet.

References should consist of 80 percent of journal articles and preferably from the most recent year. Please ensure that reference information is complete and accurate (if any, DOI should be included). Paying attention to proper capitalization on the title (only the first word in the title is capitalized, the rest must be lowercase).
