Submit Concerns to MySpokane311

Although the submission period for Cycle 15/2028-29 closed on March 31st, you can still submit traffic/streets concerns through the MySpokane311 portal. <https://myspokane311.my.site.com/citizen/s/> Click on the Safe Streets Survey (Traffic Calming). You will have an opportunity to provide written comments and attach photos.

Send an Email to the Spokane Police Department

Call the Traffic Hotline at 509-625-4150

For speeding violations or other traffic concerns, please call the Traffic Hotline. You'll get a recording -leave a message with details about the vehicle, time, date, and location.

Call Crime Check at 509-456-2233

To report serious driving violations other than speeding such as aggressive or reckless driving or a motor vehicle accident, please contact Crime Check. Be prepared to share as much information as possible such as make/model/color of car, location, time and date.
