

Portsmouth founding Bill

The importance of our naval forces can't be understated. This bill is intended to give the Ministry guidance for the establishment of a new city.

1. The Ministry and Governor of London are to foster the creation of another city on the coast.
 - a. The City so founded shall forever bear the name *Portsmouth*.
 - b. The city must have a tile suitable for a Republican Dockyard.
 - c. If feasible, an environment with high production bonuses shall be chosen.
 - d. The requirements of this paragraph shall not be construed to require the founding of Portsmouth in a location deemed indefensible or unsuitable for any city, in the opinion of the Ministry or the founding Governor.
 - e. The requirements of this paragraph shall not be construed to prevent the founding of other cities deemed necessary to England's growth, while a suitable location for Portsmouth is yet to be identified.
2. The Governor overseeing Portsmouth is guided, but not required, to develop the city as the center of English naval production through the following actions:
 - a. Construction of a Republican Dockyard
 - b. improvement of production resources
 - c. Production of the most advanced naval units available.
3. The Governor overseeing Portsmouth is further guided, but not required, to construct a Lighthouse for military signaling purposes.
