ATTENDANCE

****The Dearborn Public School District Policy will be adhered to for all attendance concerns. Attendance is important to the success of all students, and we need your support to help in the success of the students.

Whenever your child will be absent from school, you <u>must</u> call the Attendance Office **before** 7:30 am on the day of the absence at 313-827-1501. Please leave a clear message with the student's name and date of birth. If your student will need to leave school early for an appointment, it is also necessary to phone the Attendance Office. <u>Students are only allowed to leave school during passing time so as to not disturb class instruction time</u>. Your student will meet you in the attendance office. **Parents must come into the building to sign the student out.** Any absence will still count towards their audit.



No student is permitted to leave the building during the school day without a pass from the attendance office. Students who do so will be considered skipping and will receive disciplinary action. Students that have more than 10 absences, that are not extenuating circumstances with verified documentation, are considered to be on audit and will receive reduced credit in the classes in which they have exceeded 10 absences unless they receive a 78% or higher on the final exam.

- August 30th is a ½ day with a 10:55 dismissal. MBCC and DCMST students will stay at Edsel all day. Students who have MBCC/DCMST classes should report to the cafeteria.
- Check your class schedules again on Sunday through your <u>Student</u> or <u>ParentConnect</u> as there may still be some class changes. Email your counselor if you have any missing classes.
- During the school day, students should have their personal electronic devices (smart phones) off and stored in either their bags or lockers. Students may use them during lunchtime.
- For parents who pick-up and drop-off their students, the parking lot off of Pelham is for buses only from **7:15-8:00** AM and **2:30-3:15** AM. Any parent dropping off or picking up their student should enter the main entrance off of Rotunda or drop off their student at the gymnasium entrance.
- For the first day, students should bring something to write with (pen or pencil), something to write on (paper or notebook), and their Chromebook with charge cord if they have one.

ADD/DROPS

- All students can access their schedule via student portal/connect. *Please note- make sure to recheck your schedule before August 30th to ensure there have not been any changes.*
- All students are required to have six classes on their schedule (Except 12th grade Collegiate Academy students)
- Grades 9-11 are required to have Language Arts, Math, Science and Social Studies
- Grade 12 is required to have both Language Arts and Math
- Schedule changes can be made for ONLY:
 - missing classes
 - o a repeated class
 - an incorrect required class
- Schedule changes CANNOT be made for:
 - a teacher change
 - wanting to be with friends
 - o switching hours
 - lunch change

Audit

Please share audit information with students:

*Audit reduces a student's credit for a class from 0.5 credits to 0.25 credits for having 10 or more absences in a class. If a student does not recover the credit by passing the class, including receiving a 78% or better on the cumulative final exam, the student must take the class in **night school or summer school** to regain their full credit. Summer school costs \$350 a class and night school costs \$175 a class.

Three scenarios for a student that is on audit...

Scenario 1 – A student has 10 or more absences and is on audit but the student receives a 78% or better on their final exam:

They are no longer on audit and they receive the cumulative grade earned in the class.

Scenario 2 – A student has 10 or more absences and is on audit and the student receives a 77% or less on their final exam:

They remain on audit no matter their cumulative grade. They will have to repeat the class.

Scenario 3 – A student has 10 or more absences and is on audit but the student receives an "E" in the class, the final failure supersedes any audits and the student receives the grade.

They receive an "E" in the class. They will have to repeat the class.

THEREFORE, IT IS IMPERATIVE THAT STUDENTS BE IN SCHOOL AND IN CLASS ON TIME.

Students that have chronic tardiness and chronic absenteeism will be referred to our District's Truancy Officer who will make home visits.

Tardy Policy

Hall sweeps will continue at Edsel Ford High School as well as random checks on student attendance. Hall sweeps will occur randomly in the hallways, including at the 1st hour bell, so please ensure students are at school on time. School begins at 7:50. Hall sweeps will take place when the tardy bell rings. Any student in the hallway will be "swept" up by the administration and other staff members, and will receive a consequence based on our referral process. Consequences include, but are not limited to:

- 1. Detention the very next day
- 2. Community Service Days
- 3. Out of school suspension the same day

Please refer to the tardy policy above.

The decision for the consequence will be determined on the student's history of attendance and their cooperation in the hall sweep.

Cell Phone Policy

Lunch

Edsel High School is a closed campus. No students are to leave Edsel High School for lunch. Any students caught doing so will receive either an out of school suspension or other school consequences. Students are to remain within the school building until their school day is completed based on their schedule. In addition, students are not permitted to order from UberEats, DoorDash, GrubHub, etc.

Mask Policy

Masks have been mandated by both Wayne County and Dearborn Public Schools. Our goal is to keep everyone in school. Please adhere to wearing a mask regardless of vaccination status. We appreciate your cooperation.

Fighting

Any student that is part of a fight that does not include punches thrown but includes a verbal assault, not following the directive of an adult, or results in pushing, shoving, or advancements towards a fight will result in **Out of School Suspension** for a minimum of one day and/or additional consequences.

Any student that is part of a fight that includes a physical assault such as punches thrown or use of any body part or a foreign object as a weapon will be suspended for 5 days and receive a Disorderly Conduct ticket from the Dearborn Police Schools Liaison.

In the event that a student is part of a fight a second time that includes a physical assault such as punches thrown or use of any body part or a foreign object as a weapon, the consequences will be a **10-day suspension and a Disorderly Conduct ticket.**

If a student is part of a fight for a third time that includes a physical assault such as punches thrown or use of any body part or a foreign object as a weapon, the consequences will be a 10-day suspension plus a hearing wherein we will be requesting an additional 20 days and another ticket for Disorderly Conduct.

Insubordination/Disrespect

Any student that illustrates insubordination or disrespect to any adult at any time will receive a possible Out of School Suspension.

Edsel High School will not be responsible or liable for the theft, loss, data loss, damage, destruction, misuse or vandalism of any student's personal electronic device brought onto school property.

GRADUATION

In order for a student to be part of the graduation ceremony in June, all students must have 23 Michigan Merit credits completed at the time of graduation.

Therefore, we encourage all parents of any student that has failed one or more classes to support that their child sign up for night school ASAP and discuss possible options with their child's counselor.

Graduation Requirements

Students are required to successfully complete a total of twenty-three (23) credits for graduation:

- **4 Credits Mathematics**, including Algebra I; Geometry, Algebra II, including one (1) class in the final year of high school
- 4 Credits English/Language Arts aligned with subject area content expectations
- 3 Credits Science, including Biology; Physics or Chemistry; one (1) additional science credit
- **3 Credits Social Studies**, including .5 credit in US government; .5 credit in US economics; U.S. History and Geography; World History and Geography
- 1 Credit Physical Education/Health
- 1 Credit Visual, Performing, Applied Arts
- **2 Credits World Language -** a single world language in grades 9-12; OR have an equivalent learning experience in grades K-12. May substitute up to 1.0 credit of the 2.0 required credits with visual/performing/applied arts. (Class of 2016-2020).

Credit - Online learning experience satisfied through Computer Applications **Computer Applications -** Students must either earn a C or better in middle school OR successfully completes the high school class

Student grade level determination based on credits passed:

Freshman = Fewer than 6.0 credits Sophomore = 6.0 to less than 12.0 credits with at least 4.0 Michigan Merit Credits Junior = 12.0 to less than 17.0 credits with at least 9.0 Michigan Merit Credits Senior = 17.0 - 23.0 credits with at least 12.0 Michigan Merit Credits

In order to regain lost credits, it is important for students to attend the after school (ASAP) learning program. If your child has fallen behind due to class failure, contact your student's counselor to plan for credit recovery.

COMMENCEMENT REQUIREMENTS

Beginning with the class of 2022, students who are missing credits at the time of graduation **will not be allowed to walk with their class and participate in the graduation ceremony**. It will be required for all graduating seniors to have met all state and district graduation requirements by seniors' last day in May to participate in commencement. Please note that this is a change from past years, where some seniors (needing 1 credit) could attend summer school and were allowed to participate in commencement.

Parent Community Liaison Support
