

SAT WORDS - AND HOW I REMEMBER THEM

Haughtiness (Hot people/HOTTIES are often fairly arrogant and prideful of their good looks)
arrogance; pride

Riddled (Politicians speak in Riddles. Usually because what they're saying is full of holes. Or crap. It depends.) full of (usually full of holes)

Abhor (The doctor *abhors* violence – like Davros said) hate

Bigot (Bigfoot is a Bigot – He hates everything but his kind, so he never shows his face)
narrow-minded, prejudiced person

Ephemeral (HA MEYRL. I'VE FINALLY BEAT YOU AT AN ARGUMENT. ... *E
MERYL*. YOU SHOT ME. His victory is short lived) short-lived

Counterfeit (Docs paper; Counterfeit money) fake; false

Hamper (The hamper obstructs my way when it's dark and I'm trying to move in my room)hinder; obstruct

Noxious (Lethal things are rather obNOXIOUS) harmful; poisonous; lethal

Placid (You stay long at PLACid PLACes) calm; peaceful

Remuneration (ReMUNERation MONEY) payment for work done

Abrasive (Nine's rather aBRASHive, [Brash as in rough as well]) rough; coarse; harsh

Covert (COVERt COVERED, secret, Covert affairs) hidden; undercover

Hangar (ClothEs on a hangEr, Airplanes on a hangAr) storage area (like garage) for a plane

Knotty(kNOTeasY to solve) complex; difficult to solve

Renown (REally kNOWN) fame

Tangent (Tenth Doc likes Tangents – TENgent!) going off the main subject

Abasement (You hide in a basement when you're humiliated) humiliation; degradation

Billowing (Blow on a tiny flag and it'll billow) swelling; fluttering; waving

Harangue (Attack with BoomerANGUEs. But speaking) noisy, attacking speech

Nullify (Null – 0 –give Zero importance) to counter; make unimportant

Tangible (TangIBLE TouchIBLE) can be touched

Abrogate (Abolish at the gate) cancel; deny; repeal

Blasphemy ("BLASPHEMY" -God) speech which offends religious sentiments

Credible (Opposite of incredible) believable

Enigma (The Riddler's name is Ed Nigma for a reason) puzzle; mystery

Harbingers (hARBINGER wARNINGER Warning Bringer) indicators; bringers of warnings

Labyrinthine (Complex like a Labrynth) complicated; highly convoluted

Nuzzle (<-All these words kinda rhyme->) cuddle; snuggle

Plaudit (When you applaud it's giving praise) statement giving strong praise

Blatant (disregard for...) obvious

Creditable (Deserves credit. And Praise) praiseworthy

Hasten (to) hurry; accelerate; rush

Credulous (opp of incredulous) gullible; ready to believe anything

Enshroud (Shroud/Fog covers its surroundings) cover

Lachrymose (Like reMORSE) tearful; sad

Obfuscate (The word itself is hard to understand. Obstruct our understanding) deliberately make something difficult to understand

Plethora (Doc has a plethora of bananas on the TARDIS.) an excess

Repudiate (ESCHEW THE NONBELIEVER. REPUDIATE THEM) shun; eschew

Tedium (Tedious) boredom

Abstemious (Like abstinence) self denying; refraining from indulging

Blithe (bLIVE your life free) free-spirited; carefree

Crepuscular (Crepes take a freaking long time to make. Start early. Like at dawn) active at dawn and dusk

Enunciation (Enunciation/Pronunciation Excellent PronuNCIATION) clear pronunciation; accent; articulation

Lackluster (Lacks luster, excitement, etc.) dull; monotonous; bland

Objective (A jury's objective should be to be objective) unbiased; not subjective

Pliable (You can move it with pliers) flexible; not stubborn

Blunderbuss (1.Hehe. You're on your own. 2. BLUNDER BUSS sounds like a nickname you'd give to a clumsy person) 1. Ancient weapon (type of gun); 2. a clumsy person

Envenom (Injecting Venom into someone would make them pretty bitter towards you. Until they died, of course) to cause bitterness and bad feeling

Podium (Like for a speech) raised platform

Acrid (Vinegar is an ACID and is rather ACRID) sharp; pungent (used of smells and tastes)

Boorish (BOO at rude people) ill-mannered

Poignant (Poignant speech, BOY that was POYgnant) deeply moving; strongly affecting the

emotions

Respite (restspite) a break; intermission

Acrophobia (Also known as AH!HELL-NOPhobia) fear of heights

Bourgeois (It literally used to mean they're trousers are capris. They're not wealthy enough for full trousers, but they're wealthier than shorts. In the middle) middle class

Debility (Instead of getting an A, you have a D, so you have a weakness in that subject. So, not an Ability, a Dbility) weakness; incapacity

Acuity (ACcUraTe at shooting if you have acuity) sharpness (mental or visual)

Braggart (BRAG) someone who boasts

Debunking (You get kicked off the top bunk if you lie. When Scar(LK) was debunked he was kicked lower. Off the rock. Bunk. Um. Bad analogy maybe.) exposing false claims or myths

Hidebound (Once you bind a book, it's published and hard to change.) rigid in opinions

Histrionic (HIS STORIES are often exaggerated) theatrical; exaggerated

Laud (PRAISE THE LAUD[lord]) praise

Obstreperous (OBviously you STRain your voice shouting) noisy and boisterous

Portend (most psychics are just portending to tell the future) foretell

Broach (Broach topic of) start to discuss; approach

Brusque (Brusque Wayne will bluntly and abruptly tell you he has to run[to fight crime]) blunt; abrupt

Defoliate (DE foliate. simple) cause leaves to fall off

Espouse (Support your spouse or she'll be your ExSPOUSE) take up; support

Poseur (THEY'RE JUST POSERS.) someone who puts on an act

Bulwark (a line of bulls would make a nice barricade) fortification; barricade; wall

Defunct (We debunked Scar. Then, we Defuncted him. [he was eaten by hyenas so no longer exists])no longer in existence

Hyperbole (HYPERBOLE IS THE BEST THING EVER. [and it's pronounced hyper-bo-lee])

grossly exaggerated speech
