Lesson Title

Career Path Discovery 10 Weeks Series – Session 4: "Various Job Titles, Credentials, Resume Experience"

Duration

1 hour

Lesson Plan

1. Introduction (5 minutes)

- Briefly review previous sessions.
- Introduce today's topic focusing on job titles, necessary credentials, and resume building.

2. Job Title Exploration Activity (15 minutes)

- Discuss various job titles across different industries (e.g., healthcare, education, technology, art).
- Interactive game: "Job Title Match-Up," where kids match job titles to industries.

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3. Credential Discussion (10 minutes)

- Explain what credentials mean (degrees, certificates, licenses).
- Introduce a few examples of required credentials for common jobs.

4. Resume Building Workshop (15 minutes)

- Explain what a resume is and its importance.
- Provide a simple resume template and guide students to fill in their own details, imagining their future experiences and skills.

5. Group Sharing and Feedback (10 minutes)

- Allow students to share their resumes with a peer or the group.
- Offer positive feedback and suggest potential improvements.

6. Conclusion and Reflection (5 minutes)

- Summarize the key points learned.
- Encourage students to think about the type of job they might like and what steps they could take towards that career.

- Examples of credentials (visual cards or printed information)
- Printed blank resume templates

Adaptations for Different Ages

- Younger Children (ages 6–8): Use simpler job titles and focus on discussing their favorite tasks. Provide more visual aids.
- Older Children (ages 9–12): Introduce more complex job titles and focus on realistic skills and hobbies they can include on a resume.

Movement Break

- 5 Minutes: Career Charades. Students act out a job role using gestures only, while others guess the job title.

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Bonus Activities

- Create a "Career Collage": Gather magazine clippings or printouts. Students make collages of various job titles and credentials.
- Host a "Career Day": Invite parents or community members to talk about their jobs and the credentials needed.

Series Outline

Week 1: Introduction to Career Exploration

- Discuss and brainstorm different types of careers children already know.
- Activity: Career Collage, where students create a collage of careers they find interesting using magazines or printed images.
- pick 4 main career groups to focus on for the next 8 weeks.

Week 2: Exploring Various Job Titles

- Introduce major categories like healthcare, technology, arts, etc.
- Activity: Career Matching Game, where students match job titles to descriptions.
- Research Project: Assign a job title for students to research and present.

Week 3: Understanding Credentials and Education

- Explain the role of education and specific credentials in different careers.
- Activity: Create an educational path diagram for a chosen career.
- Interactive Q&A: Share and discuss different credential requirements across professions.

Week 4: Developing Skills for the Future

- Discuss important skills like communication, teamwork, and problem-solving.
- Activity: Team-building games that emphasize collaboration.
- Workshop: Skill-building exercises such as public speaking or coding basics.

Week 5: Resume Building Basics

- Explain the purpose and structure of a resume.
- Activity: Create a mock resume with accomplishments and skills based on personal experiences.
- Peer Review: Students exchange resumes for feedback and improvements.

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Week 6: Experiential Learning Through Internship & Volunteering

- Discuss the benefits of internships and volunteering in career development.
- Activity: Role-playing interview scenarios for internships.
- Research and plan: Identify local opportunities for internships or volunteer work.

Week 7: Networking and Building Connections

- Explain the concept and importance of networking.
- Activity: Write and practice a simple introduction or elevator pitch.
- Networking Simulation: A networking event role-play where students interact with one another.

Week 8: Entrepreneurship and Innovation

- Introduce the basics of entrepreneurship and thinking outside the box.
- Activity: Business idea brainstorming and presentation competition.
- Guest Speaker: Invite a young entrepreneur to share their story and take questions.

Week 9: Technology and the Future of Work

- Discuss how technology is changing different industries.
- Activity: Group project to create a futuristic job concept using technology.
- Research Future Trends: Investigate how AI and automation impact career paths.

Week 10: Career Reflection and Goal Setting

- Reflect on what students learned and identify careers that interest them most.
- Activity: Create a career vision board detailing steps to achieve their goals.
- Goal Setting Workshop: Develop a personal action plan for future career exploration and development.
