Principal & Teacher Report

4 goals:

Achieve: we've had 2 sessions of professional learning for staff in Math and Moderated Marking. EQAO testing results: we are lowest in math, below both TDSB and provincial results. Moderated Marking: teachers meet and share student work to discuss how well students are meeting curriculum expectations.

Belong: looking at School Code of Conduct and Skating.

CoC has been sent with newsletter three times and is posted in all classrooms. We ask that parents share this with their children and reinforce student expectations, peaceful conflict resolution, empathy, etc. We follow progressive discipline, consequences vary according to different needs, frequency, etc.

Skating: Dates are booked, cost is shared with council. 137 responses to survey so far, please remind families to fill out. New to note: all students **and volunteers** have to wear a helmet this year. Question: are we accepting donations yet? Answer: yes, they can bring them to the office

Thrive: All students graduate with the confidence, skills and knowledge to thrive. Upcoming career fair provides an opportunity for students to connect with parents/community members who have experience in skilled trades. If anyone knows anyone who is in the skilled trades, pass their contacts on to Jen and she will arrange. Communication will go to wider community in January. Brie to help out Jen and Heather with fair details.

Revitalize: New modern, safe, accessible kindergarten playground is open. *Question:* Do older students get a chance to check out the playground? Answer: yes, it is intended for kindergarten but other classes will get a chance to check it out

Movie nights: Halloween and Holiday both went really well, strong attendance, approx \$250-\$350 raised after expenses

Readathon: Strong fundraising and execution. Raised \$2800

• Prizes earned are bookmarks, milk and cookies recess and trip to Arcadia Earth

New Clubs Overview- Summary of Enrichment Fund Activities:

- 1. Lacrosse day: really well done and engaging, great experience. School was able to purchase lacrosse equipment, whole new sport for the school to enjoy.
- 2. Choir: 47 students, new uniforms purchased, trip to Kiwanis upcoming
- 3. Chess club: 45 students signed up, starting January 20 for 5 weeks.
- 4. Comic Book Club to launch in March when chess is done.

Upcoming Activities:

- 1. Pizza days December 19th and January 23rd. Exploring Pizza Pizza but they require a \$1k advance, Ros may look into this. Bonus: many locations are Halal so no more separate ordering. Potential to raise \$100 more per pizza day.
- 2. Popcorn Recess: Jan 9. Reminders have gone to parents, orders need to be in before holidays. *Double check that all flavours are Halal*.
- 3. Skating: when should we have Hot Chocolate? Miss I will handle hot chocolate if the parent council funds it. We already have cups, just supply the hot chocolate and Miss I will handle the rest. Marshmallows are unnecessary (too much sugar and not Halal)
- 4. Arcadia Earth Field Trip: need to sit with Miss Abi to discuss dates/buses. Want to do it during Earth Week. DD classes would prefer a trip to Variety Village for LG games at the end of Feb (free trip). Brie, Heather and Amanda to meet with Miss Abi after Pizza on Thursday to discuss Question: Are all classes going at once? Answer: would be better to do two or three groups.
- 5. Camp Fair: earlier in the year, get ahead of city booking dates. Slated for Jan 29th at DA Morrison, permit has been requested. \$375 per camp (early bird \$350). 25-30 camps targeted. Marketing target: parents to 6-14 year old kids. Flyer the community and the kids at Parkside and DA. Targeted email communications within local schools. Facebook Groups postings and paid social ads. Next steps: email camps by Dec 18 and follow up in Jan. Marketing begins in Jan.
