

# Podcast Assignment

**Objective:** Create a 5-7 minute podcast on a topic of your choice (sports, education, celebrities, true crime, politics, or other approved topics). The podcast should feature a commercial for a sponsor and incorporate at least one audio effect using Audacity.

## **Project Breakdown:**

### **1. Topic Selection:**

- Choose a topic from the provided list (or get approval for an alternative topic). Make sure it's something you are passionate about and can discuss in depth for the required time length.
- Some example topics might be:
  - **Sports:** A deep dive into a specific team, game, or athlete.
  - **Education:** The impact of technology on learning, or the future of education.
  - **Celebrities:** Discussing the life and career of a famous person, or trends in celebrity culture.
  - **True Crime:** Overview of a famous case, or exploration of lesser-known incidents.
  - **Politics:** Current events, political ideologies, or profiles of political figures.

### **2. Script Writing:**

- Draft a script that will guide your discussion.
- Be sure to do research to help you with coming up with valid arguments, information, or anything else that will be used in your podcast.
- Make sure to include an **intro** (introducing your topic and podcast), a **main content segment** (where you talk about your topic in-depth), and an **outro** (wrapping up and thanking listeners).
- **Sponsor Commercial:** Create a fictional sponsor and write a brief, engaging ad for them. The ad should be around 30 seconds long and flow naturally with the rest of the podcast.

### **3. Audio Editing with Audacity:**

- **Record Your Podcast:** Use a clear and steady speaking voice. Be sure to edit out any awkward pauses or mistakes during recording.
- **Include One Effect:** This can be sound effects, music, or editing techniques like fade-in/fade-out. Examples:
  - **Sound Effects:** Add a relevant sound to enhance a point in your podcast (e.g., crowd noises for a sports podcast, or police sirens for a true crime story).
  - **Music:** You can use royalty-free music for your intro/outro or for transitions between sections.
  - **Volume Adjustment:** Use fades, equalization, or noise reduction to improve the sound quality.

### **4. Commercial Integration:**

- Include the commercial seamlessly into your podcast. It should feel like a natural part of the show.
- You can use sound effects (e.g., jingles, background music) to make it feel more like an authentic ad.
- Students should import the commercials they have already created in class.

#### 5. Final Production:

- Export the final podcast file (MP3 or WAV).
- Double-check the length (5-7 minutes).
- Make sure the sound levels are balanced so that listeners can hear you clearly, even when effects or music are present.

- **Podcast Length:** 5-7 minutes.
- **Content:** Clear and engaging topic discussion with a sponsor commercial.
- **Audio Editing:** Two distinct audio effects are used effectively.
- **File Format:** MP3 or WAV file.

1. Intro music with fade-in effect

2. Introduction ( introduce your podcast name, your names, and what today's podcast will be about)
3. Thank your sponsor for your show and play commercial
4. Commercial
5. Discuss your topic using researched arguments/ points to support your claims.
  - Effect during the podcast
6. Conclusions
7. Exit music with fade-out effect

- Celebrity: Talk about an artist's new album, who are the top rappers/ musicians/ etc., or other topics related to celebrities.
- TV Show/ Movie: Discuss season predictions, discuss the latest episode of a show, and provide a review/ critique.
- Education: Discuss with the audience your findings on a particular topic (health benefits of ...., problems with ....., conspiracy theory, etc.)
