Astor, Col. John Jacob	1st Class Passenger	47	Male	The wealthiest man on board. He was traveling with his young, pregnant second wife, Madeleine.
Astor, Mrs. Madeleine	1st Class Passenger	18	Female	Wife of Col. John Jacob Astor IV, the wealthiest man on board. She was traveling with her husband and was pregnant at the time.
Brown, Mrs. Margaret "Molly"	1st Class Passenger	44	Female	A wealthy American socialite. She was returning from a trip abroad.

Ismay, Mr. Joseph Bruce	White Star Line Chairman (1st Class)	49	Male	Chairman and Managing Director of the White Star Line. He was traveling on the maiden voyage of his company's flagship.
Allen, Miss Elisabeth	1st Class Passenger	29	Female	Traveling with family, she was a niece of a former U.S. Senator.
Guggenheim, Mr. Benjamin	1st Class Passenger	46	Male	American mining magnate.
Stead, Mr. William Henry T.	1st Class Passenger	62	Male	A famous British journalist and editor. A vocal spiritualist, he had written fictional stories predicting a similar disaster years earlier.
Carter, Mr. William E.	1st Class Passenger	36	Male	Wealthy American from an established family. He was traveling with his wife and children.

Straus, Mrs. Ida	1st Class Passenger	63	Female	Wife of Isidor Straus (co-owner of Macy's).
Beesley, Mr. Lawrence	2nd Class Passenger	34	Male	Science teacher from London.
Quick, Mrs. Stella P. C.	2nd Class Passenger	33	Female	Traveling to her home in Detroit with her family after visiting England.
Quick, Master Harold J.	2nd Class Passenger	4	Male	Youngest son of Mrs. Stella Quick, traveling with his family.
Harper, Rev. John	2nd Class Passenger	39	Male	A well-known Baptist minister from Scotland. He was traveling to preach in Chicago.
Buss, Miss Kate E.	2nd Class Passenger	36	Female	Traveling to the U.S. to marry her fiancé.
Vandyck, Mr. Charles R.	2nd Class Passenger	29	Male	Traveling on business.
Cohen, Mr. Gershon	3rd Class Passenger	19	Male	English printer traveling to Boston

Rush, Mr. Alfred G. J.	3rd Class Passenger	17	Male	He was traveling to Detroit, Michigan, to join his older brother Charles and start a new life in America.
Wennerström, Mr. August H.	3rd Class Passenger	27	Male	Swedish journalist and social activist traveling to Chicago.
Balls, Mrs Ada Elizabeth	2nd Class Passenger	36	Female	English woman traveling to Florida with plans for her sons to follow and meet her there.
Heikkinen, Miss Laina	3rd Class Passenger	16	Female	A Finnish woman emigrating to the U.S.
O'Connell, Mr. Patrick D.	3rd Class Passenger	18	Male	An Irish farm laborer emigrating to New York.
Abbott, Mrs. Rhoda M.	3rd Class Passenger	39	Female	English woman who was returning to Rhode Island with her two sons.

Abbott, Master Eugene J. A.	3rd Class Passenger	13	Male	Traveling with his mother and brother to Rhode Island.
Borebank, Mr. John J.	1st Class Passenger	41	Male	An English Canadian businessman returning to Toronto after attending the Coronation festivities of King George V in England
Panula, Mr. Eino W.	3rd Class Passenger	1	Male	The youngest of five children traveling with his mother to join his father in Pennsylvania.
Jansson, Mr. Carl O.	3rd Class Passenger	21	Male	A Swedish immigrant bound for America, believed to be fleeing conscription.
Brailey, Mr. William T. R.	2nd Class Passenger	24	Male	Pianist, one of the 8 performing musicians on the Titanic
Fleet, Mr. Frederick	Lookout (Crew)	24	Male	The Lookout who first spotted the iceberg.

Smith, Capt. Edward J.	Captain (Crew)	62	Male	Captain of the Titanic. It was intended to be his final voyage before retirement.
Lightoller, Mr. Charles H.	Second Officer (Crew)	38	Male	The highest-ranking officer. He was in charge of launching the port-side lifeboats.
Lowe, Mr. Harold G.	Fifth Officer (Crew)	29	Male	An Officer for whom the Titanic was the first transatlantic voyage.
Butt, Major Archibald G. W.	1st Class Passenger	46	Male	Military aide to President Taft and Theodore Roosevelt.
Jessop, Miss Violet	Stewardess (Crew)	25	Female	An experienced stewardess. She had previously survived the collision of the Olympic.

Murdoch, Mr. William M.	First Officer (Crew)	39	Male	Officer on the bridge when the iceberg was spotted. Credited with giving the order to turn the ship in an attempt to avoid the iceberg.
Rule, Mr. Samuel J.	Scullion (Crew)	58	Male	Bathroom attendant for first class passengers
Laroche, Mr. Joseph	2nd Class Passenger	25	Male	One of the few Black passengers on board. A Haitian engineer, he was traveling with his pregnant French wife and two young daughters to move to Haiti.
Cassebeer, Mrs. Eleanor G.	1st Class Passenger	36	Female	A wealthy American traveling to New York to see her son.

Cardeza, Mrs. Charlotte W.	1st Class Passenger	58	Female	An heir to a Pennsylvania fortune. She and her son had the most expensive suite on the ship and brought 14 trunks.
Rice, Mr. George E.	3rd Class Passenger	8	Male	Canadian boy traveling with his mother and four brothers.
Brown, Miss Elizabeth C.	2nd Class Passenger	44	Female	South African woman whose family decided to move to America. Traveling with her husband and daughter.
Harrison, Mr. William H.	1st Class Passenger	46	Male	Secretary of the White Star Line president, John Ismay
Hitchens, Mr. Robert H.	Quartermaster (Crew)	29	Male	Quartermaster who was at the wheel when the iceberg was struck.

Dean, Master Millvina	3rd Class Passenger	<1 (2 months)	Female	The youngest passenger on board. She was traveling with her mother and brother.
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
