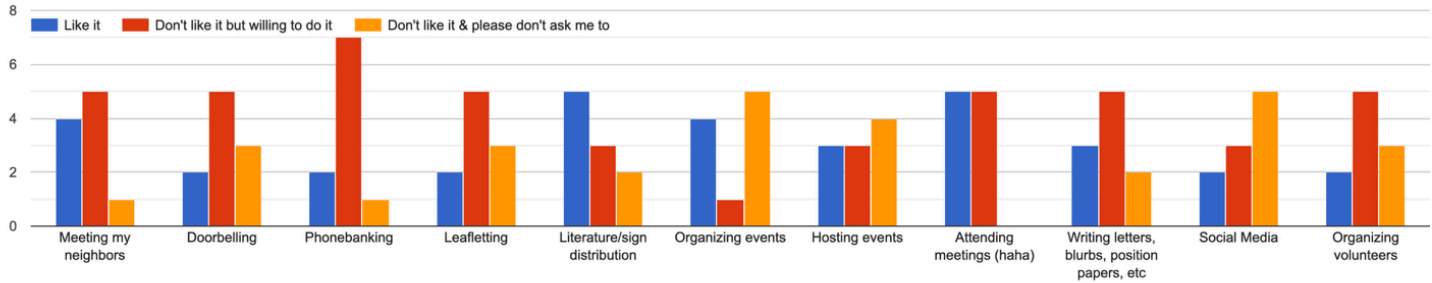

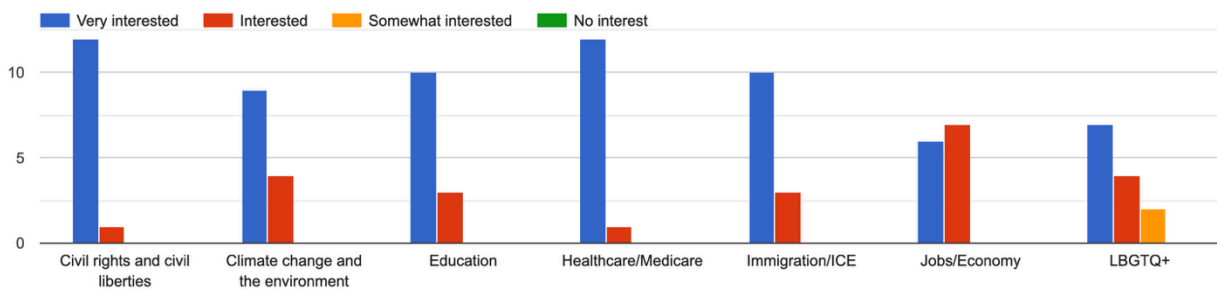
Other political work people enjoy:

Questions about being a PCO

- How can we get more people engaged?
- None but need ongoing training in Votebuilder
- I do not know enough about being a POC to answer. I expressed interest in knowing more in an email to the OK Democrats. Never received a reply and someone at my Fellowship, who is a POC, said I was on the agenda for the next meeting and I was voted in. I have now attended the Zoom meetings, became involved in some events and read through the POC handbook. I have concerns over what it means to be a POC under the new districting. I think redistricting is needed, but the idea of having a district of 300-600 overwhelms me.
- What more should I be doing?

- I'd like to know what effectively organized PCOs can hope to do. In other words, what models are there and has worked well elsewhere.
