3. Click on the Registration TAB to register for the Saturday, August 29, 2020 All Regions Virtual Conference and the Friday, August 28, 2020 regional IVP Premiere Events. Please click on the registration link, complete the registration form and click on **SUBMIT**.
4. A confirmation that says, “Thank you for registering” will be shown on your screen. To register for any of the sessions by Zoom, please complete the form by clicking the button “Register for Zoom Sessions.” You will receive a Zoom invitation for the session by the presenter/host at a later date.

5. Immediately after you register, a confirmation email will be forwarded to you **with the link** to the All Regions Virtual Conference. On August 29, 2020 please click on the **Join Webinar** button.
6. The links for the narrated PowerPoint and video Enhancement Sessions and Leadership Training sessions will be posted on the All Regions Virtual Conference website on Saturday, August 29th after the virtual conference. Members may access the sessions at their pleasure.

VIRTUAL ATTENDANCE AT CHAPTER MEETINGS GUIDELINES

Life circumstances, from time to time, prohibit in-person meetings. Under the following circumstances, sisters may meet virtually.

- Individuals who face geographical barriers, illness (personal or family member for whom they serve as caretaker), inclement weather, or other unforeseen circumstances.
- In case of widespread local, state, or federal emergency, inclement weather conditions, or other unforeseen circumstances, chapters may choose to meet virtually.

Those members attending virtually have the same rights and responsibilities as members attending face-to-face meetings. Virtual meetings should

follow protocol for face-to-face meetings (agenda, roll call, minutes taken, all active members vote).

Your Chapter President received detailed guidelines for virtual attendance at chapter meetings and I am sure she will share that information with chapter members.
