

Work For Art Concept

- ***Review of Concept:***
 - Compositions: The term composition is understood as a whole piece of art that is conveyed in either two-dimensional or three-dimensional art (Alberta Education, 1984).
- ***Work for Art Concept:***
 - Students are to discuss how the space they created on SketchUp is accessible as the learning outcome focuses on how structural design can enhance human activities. As shown below, it highlights the features of the solution that was created on Sketchup, which was the Shipping Container Café.

The following accessible spaces are integrated into the Shipping Container Café to promote accessibility for wheelchair users:

1. **Ramp:** The ramp that is included in the front of the entrance of the shipping container café allows wheelchair users to easily be able to enter and exit the café. In this café, the paths are flat and the other area, which is in the front entrance has a slight slope through the ramp. This allows wheelchair users to have a physical entrance that is welcoming and accessible for everyone.
2. **Low-rise Countertops:** The low-rise countertops for the cashier become easier for wheelchair users as it allows the individual to easily be able to communicate with the staff member when paying and explaining what the order is. As well as, encourages a space for comfort.
3. **Low-rise Tables:** The low-rise tables allow wheelchair users to easily be able to eat and prevent the tables from being higher for them when eating.
4. **Non-slip Surfaces:** By utilizing non-slip surfaces in the shipping container café, it allows for minimization of injury to be considered. The flooring that is utilized is oak hardwood particularly engineered hardwood, which is a textured surface that provides a good grip for the wheels of the wheelchair and the wood is durable to withstand the weight of the wheelchair.
5. **Wide Space:** There is wide space throughout the café, hence there is limited seating to encourage more room to move throughout the space such as wide aisles.
6. **Empty Space For Seating:** Throughout this café, there is empty space at tables to encourage wheelchair users to be able to easily push their wheelchairs in between the tables when eating and not be required to move around furniture. These empty spaces have accessible signs on them to convey that they are able to sit there.

7. **Doors are Kept Open:** The shipping container café is open so that there is no obstacle for the wheelchair users to open any door and there are no doors, in general, to allow for open space.
8. **Light:** The interior design regarding light is not too bright or dark, which allows light to be evenly distributed in the space for safety reasons.
