

What are beaches like in Hobe Sound, FL?



Near the Atlantic ocean, Hobe Sound is an exurban area in Martin County. It includes Jupiter Island and stretches along the coast between Port Salerno and Jonathan Dickinson State Park. Hobe Sound is a home to beautiful beaches where people can spend quality time. If you plan to go to any beach in Hobe Sound or want to have salt air therapy, you should have a look at the weather forecast and then choose which beach to visit since every beach has its own personality. In this article, we discuss the beaches in Hobe Sound, Florida and how they are like. Moreover, we also talk about the secret beach in the end that you can find in Hobe Sound. Here are the beaches of Hobe Sound and what you can find there:

1. Peck Lake / Boat Beach

Peck lake, also known as Boat beach, is found in the north end of Jupiter Island. If you go by the boat over to Peck Lake, anchor your boat, walk over and you get to the pristine beach. It's absolutely beautiful over there. There are no houses and buildings. It's very primitive since it has no lifeguards and other facilities. This beach is quite

peaceful because of the few people there. It's just you, the beach and maybe a couple other boaters. The maximum number of people that we have ever seen there probably is 15. This beach is the north part of the National Wildlife Refuge which gets confused because there are actually two Hobe Sound Wildlife Refuge. It's all part of the same network but there are two locations, totally separate from each other. Therefore, Hobe Sound Nature Center is a part of the Hobe Sound National Wildlife Refuge. The Nature Center is located in US-1. It's a really great place to take your family there. You can find nature trails and a beach. You can go fishing. Furthermore, you can bring dogs. In addition to that, they have a wonderful educational center that has a lot of local wildlife or you can take your personal pet and maybe even an alligator or a snake. This beach also serves as a fun location for those who don't have boats and who like to fish in the intercoastal area.



2. Refuge / North Beach

Towards the most northern part that you can drive to on the island, is the Hobe Sound National Wildlife Refuge, of which Peck Lake Beach is a part. It's just not easily accessible except for by boat. There is a fee to get in here and that is \$5 or you can



also buy an annual pass that is a great option. If you have pets, this is not the beach for you to bring them to. Hobe Sound has other beaches that are pet friendly. This is, however, a surf beach. It drops off very deep and makes straight great waves. This is the beach commonly known as North beach since it is in the north end of Hobe Sound. This is a national park and also a part of the Hobe Sound National Wildlife Refuge which can confuse you if you're a googler because there are two of them. This one is the ocean

access part of the National Wildlife Refuge System. There's no lifeguard at this beach so please keep that in consideration when you're planning to go to this beach. If it's a windy day and there's a lot of undertow, you probably would not choose this beach to visit because of its insecurity due to unavailability of lifeguards.

3. Hobe Sound Public Beach

This Beach is accessible to anyone and everyone. It is located on the pristine Jupiter Island. You can access this beach through the banyan covered roadway of Bridge Road. This Beach has no entrance fee and zero parking fee. You can bring dogs and it has a lifeguard. There is a sidewalk going from Hobe Sound main streets into the public beach. Much easy access! This Beach has restrooms and showers. They also have a handicap accessible chair.



4. Blowing Rocks

Going further south of Jupiter Island, there is a South Beach down there, known as Blowing Rocks. It is the south part of Martin County from where Palm Beach County



starts. It has 73 acres of Coquina limestone formations. Moreover, it has a Nature Center. Fee to get here is \$2 per person, however, kids under the age of 12 are free of charge to enter. There are nature trails and when you get there, you see all the beautiful rocks. The water crashes into those rocks and goes up to at least 15 feet into the air. These scenes create great backdrops for photography. A lot of wedding and engagement photoshoots are done at this beach. It is

really a great place to get away from the typical flat sandy beach and see something different, nature puts on a great show most days there.
