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## The Origins of CHAMPS – Supporting Children With CHD

The Children's Healthy-Heart Activity Monitoring Program in Saskatchewan (also known as CHAMPS) began as a vision from heart mom Lynne Telfer (RN), who saw a need for more support for children with congenital or acquired heart disease. Through her work as a nurse she was aware of the extensive cardiac rehabilitation programs for adults, but when looking for similar support for her son she realized that resources were limited and/or non-existent for children with CHD.

Lynne met Juanita Praksas, another heart mom, and together they approached researchers from the College of Kinesiology and College of Medicine at the University of Saskatchewan, as well as the Department of Psychology at the University of Regina to help bridge the gap in care. Alongside Pediatric Cardiology doctors & nurse clinicians at Jim Pattison Children's Hospital (Saskatoon, Saskatchewan) and other patient family advocates, [CHAMPS Camp](#) was developed.

In 2015, the first CHAMPS summer day camp was held at the University of Saskatchewan. Since then, positive feedback and continued support from heart families has contributed to the success and growth of CHAMPS camp. Below is an overview of the program progression in Saskatchewan:

CHAMPS Camp stemmed from a need and desire to provide children with heart conditions the resources they deserve to be able to THRIVE! We have developed **three main pillars** that guide this mission and our programming:

1. Physical activity promotion and participation

## **A One-of-a-Kind Experience**

To our knowledge, CHAMPS camp is a one of a kind program in North America. Our day camp style approach provides an environment where children and their families have opportunities to participate in sessions both independently and together. Our model also provides a feasible way for families to access programming all year round.

Now in our 7th year, we have seen the positive impact of this model. Children have more confidence, autonomy, and are able to realize their full potential outside of camp. Parents/Guardians feel better equipped to “let go”, and feel a sense of relief knowing their child has the tools to manage their condition independently.

CHAMPS Camp is unique in that we have a [research program](#) to provide the most relevant, evidence-based programming for heart kids. Our research areas include: body composition, cardiovascular physiology, exercise capacity, exercise prescription, mental wellness, nutrition, physical literacy, psychology and growth & development.

*\*NOTE: It is **not** a requirement to include research if you are setting up a CHAMPS program in your area. Children are **not** required to participate in research to attend camp. You will have access to all previous & current research, outcomes and content in this guide.*
