Fire debris removal covers the large-scale hauling of charred and fire-damaged material from commercial properties in Modesto, CA after a fire event. This is removal and hauling only. Fixtures and contents beyond recovery are loaded and hauled at scale, with material sorted so recyclable metals are separated from general fire waste.

Melted & Heat-Damaged Material Removal

[Melted and heat-damaged material removal](#) clears material that has melted, warped, or been heat-damaged near the fire source, including plastics, fixtures, and building components affected by extreme heat. This material often cannot be salvaged and requires sorting before disposal. Crews remove and haul it as part of the full fire debris clearance.

Post-Fire Site Clearance

[Post-fire site clearance](#) is the full clearance of a commercial site after a fire, gathering charred material, ash, fixtures, and debris in a coordinated operation. The work leaves the property cleared and ready for reconstruction contractors, removing the gap between the fire event and the start of rebuilding once any required mitigation is complete.

SECTION 3 | WHY REDTAG

Why RedTag Property Mitigation for Fire Debris Removal in Modesto

Clearing fire debris at commercial scale needs a licensed contractor, the right equipment, and correct disposal of contaminated material. These are the practical reasons commercial property owners and managers in Modesto use RedTag for fire debris clearance.

CSLB Licensed General Contractor

Hauling charred structural material and fire-contaminated debris from California properties is construction-related work that requires a CSLB contractor license. Many small operators are not licensed for this scope. RedTag operates as a CSLB licensed General Contractor under license number 1130391, covering fire debris clearance from commercial and industrial properties throughout Modesto.

Correct Disposal of Contaminated Material

Ash, fire suppressant residue, and soot-contaminated debris require sorting and separate disposal from general waste. RedTag handles fire debris disposal correctly, separating contaminated material, recyclable metals, and structural debris, and delivering each to facilities permitted to accept that material type rather than mixing everything into one load.

Heavy Equipment for Structural Debris

Burned structural material and collapsed building components are heavy and hazardous to handle. SECTION 4 | HOW THIS SERVICE WORKS

How Fire Debris Removal Works in Modesto

fire debris clearance in Modesto follows a clear process from site assessment through documented disposal. The steps below describe how the work proceeds after a fire event at a commercial property.

Step 1: Site Assessment and Material Identification

The first step is a site assessment to identify the categories of fire debris present, gauge the volume, and confirm access for equipment. Charred structural material, ash, soot-contaminated debris, and unsalvageable contents are identified so each can be

sorted and disposed of correctly. Scope and crew size are confirmed with the property owner or manager.

Step 2: Equipment Mobilization

Based on the assessment, skid steers, grapples, and dump trucks are mobilized to clear structural debris, with containment for ash and contaminated material where needed. Equipment and crew size are matched to the volume so the fire-damaged site can be cleared within the timeframe confirmed during the assessment.

Step 3: Sorting and Loading by Material Type

Fire debris is sorted as it is loaded. Charred structural material, ash and fire suppressant residue, recyclable metals, and general fire waste are separated so each goes to the correct disposal facility. Ash and contaminated material are contained during loading to limit spread across the site and surrounding area.

Step 4: Compliant Disposal and Documentation

Sorted material is transported to facilities permitted to accept each fire debris type. Contaminated material is disposed of under compliant handling, recyclable metals go to recycling, and structural debris to licensed disposal. Disposal is documented by material type and quantity for the insurance claim file where the loss is insured.

Step 5: Site Confirmed Clear for Reconstruction

After hauling is complete the site is checked to confirm all fire debris is cleared and the property is ready for reconstruction contractor access. The property owner or manager confirms the cleared state before the job is closed, establishing the handoff point between debris clearance and the start of rebuilding.

Where We Work in Modesto

Merced / Fresno Corridor

Coverage extends along the Highway 99 corridor into Merced, Atwater, Livingston, Madera, Clovis, and Fresno. Commercial property owners and managers in these communities are served for fire debris clearance within the broader Central Valley service area.

Fire debris clearance focuses on getting charred and contaminated material off the property and disposed of correctly.

How is fire debris disposed of?

Fire debris is sorted by type during loading. Ash and fire suppressant residue are contained and disposed of under compliant handling, recyclable metals go to recycling, and charred structural material to licensed disposal. Each category goes to a facility permitted to accept it rather than mixing everything into one load.

Does fire debris need special handling?

Yes. Ash, soot, and fire suppressant residue are contaminated material that requires containment during loading and separate disposal from general waste. A CSLB licensed contractor handles this correctly, which is part of why fire debris clearance is not suited to a standard unlicensed junk hauler.

How is fire debris clearance priced?

Pricing is based on the volume of debris, the material categories involved, the equipment required, and the number of loads needed. The work is typically scheduled by the job, by the truckload, or by the site. A quote is confirmed after the site assessment before any work begins.

What happens to recyclable metal from a fire?

Recyclable metals such as steel framing and metal fixtures are separated during sorting and delivered to recycling facilities rather than going to landfill. Separating recyclable material from general fire debris keeps the disposal correct and reduces the share of the cleared material sent to disposal sites.
