And if you were the best person to be the manager and you were just an ordinary private in the army, and there was some guy in there who was a captain or an officer of some sort, it didn't matter - you would get the job. If you were a woman it didn't matter, you would get the job.

There were a number of women leading sections. There were a number of gay guys who were leading sections. And there were a number of guys who were just ordinary working class leading sections. The best person to do the job, did the job.
