Its WEEK 7 of High School Football in Tennessee, coming to you tonight from high above Patriot Field, nestled on the campus of White House Heritage High School. Were at the home of that Brand New Shade of Blue in White House Tennessee for this GRUDGE MATCH with Region 5-4A taking on Region 6-3A, with bragging rights on the line.

Thank you for joining us here tonight, I am your host Jim Sorrells alongside my Co-Host Kevin Criswell and WE are the Voice of the Bobcats, bringing you all that is Greenbrier High School Sports and Information. Tonight's broadcast is #BrierBuilt and is brought to you in part by The Greenbrier Athletic Club, who for over 50 years has supported The Greenbrier Football Bobcats and of course, by YOU, our fans, family and friends, as none of this is possible without your support.

Last week was another tale of two halves as that other team from the east that's decked in blue contained the Cats, 30-10. At final whistle, The Bobcats amassed 176 yards of offense, thanks mostly in part to Travarious Flood. Flood, getting the nod at Quarterback, finished the night with 50 yards passing and 75 yards on the ground and The Cats lone score. A couple other Cats with some grabs: Nate Castleman with 3 catches for 27 yards and Dalton Wilbur, 2 catches for 23. Carson Wood was the other workhorse, averaged 7.2 yards per carry when he touched the ball. Give credit to the offensive line for pushing them out of the way. Defesively, once again Dre Thomas flying all over the place, finishing with 5 solo stops, 3 assits and 2 tackles for loss. 6 total tackles for loss on the night, for Gang Green. With Friday night in the rearview, we will roll up on another team from White House that is also seeing some success this season.

The Patriots enter the night at 4-2 under their first year coach Scott Murray. Last year, The Patriots only had a single victory to their name, which they eclipsed in Week 1. Since then, The Patriots have had only one focus: Stability. Murray, the former head coach of Clarksville Academy, was thrilled to be joining a school that feels like home earlier this season and he has settled right in. Stability is a key word not only for Murray but the entire White House Heritage football team as The Patriots are now on their third head coach in the last three seasons. Last Week, it was a trip up to Pleasant View to take on Sycamore, as The Patriots escaped with a 20-14 Victory, their first on the road this season. A Freshman QB in Xavier Murray was their leader, completing 10-of-11 passes for 175 yards and two touchdowns. Leader receiver, Aric Lopez nabbed 4 balls for 82 yards one score, which was the eventual game winner. On the ground, the sensational Adrian Bonilla returned to the fold after sitting the previous week: his

stat line on the night, 21 rushes for 94 yards and one rushing touchdown while catching one pass for 21 yards and a touchdown. MaxPreps will report him averaging just over 127 yards per contest, with QB Murray throwing for 148 a game. Defensively, [Makana Coffin](#) is the one to watchout for, he is responsible for 12 stops per game. Needless to say, this is much different Patriot Team that from a year before, as they cracked the MaxPreps Top 25 this week in Class 3A.

This rivalry has been one that has brewed over the last decade or so. White House Heritage has only been playing Varsity Football since 2003. Since then: 11 playoff appearances, including a real special run in 2014 that took them all the way to the second round of the TSSAA Playoffs.

The last time we were here at Heritage, it ended up being the most exciting game of the 2020 campaign, as the Bobcats came out on top in a thrilling 43-42 victory, the last win for The Bobcats in this series. Heritage took the last meeting in 2021. All Time, The Cats lead the series 6-4.

Its sure to be another great night of Football and we are sure glad we get to spend it with you. Stay tuned!

The Tennessean saw it a bit differently this week, though they look at the lens statewide, promoting “The best game in the state (this week) will feature the two teams tied for first: Chattanooga Baylor and McCallie who will face off Friday in a Division II-AAA East Region contest. These two schools have combined to win the past three DII-AAA state championships with Baylor winning the 2022 gold ball and McCallie winning the previous three.

The most interesting movement comes at No. 25 as Greeneville drops in, with an official record of 4-0.

Looking at the AP Polls,

In 6A its once again Bradley Central NO. 1, Oakland at #2, Brentwood at #3, Germantown at #4, and Mt Juliet coming in at No. 5.

In 5A, still the team to beat: Knoxville West at No. 1, Centennial, Henry County, Southwind and Nolensville round out their Top 5. Southwind, now 6-0 for the first time in school history.

In 3A, more of the same with Alcoa at no. 1, Dyersburg at No. 2, East Nashville slipping to No. 3, Meigs County slotted in the 4th spot and Gatlinburg Pittman at No. 5.

In 2A, Riverside reigns now, on top in 1st with 12 first place votes, York jumps up two spots to #2, Marion County up two spots to #3, Milan dropping down to #4 and Huntington moving up two spots as well to finish in 5th. **Huntingdon rose those spots after knocking off last week's No. 1 in Milan.** East Robertson, still with 2 first place votes falls to 8th place, just behind the Owls of Smith County who slipped past them last week.

In 1A, South Pitt on top, Dresden, Moore Coutny, Mckenzie, Whitwell round out the top 5. Dresden, the alma mater of a co worker of mine, they have a big matchup with #8 Union City this week. Dresden looking to go 7-0 to start for the first time since 2016.

D2 – all eyes on Baylor / McCallie in D2 3A. The others: Middle Tennessee Christian and Franklin Road Academy.

In Class 4A, its Pearl Cohn All alone at the top with 16 first place votes.

Upperman in 2nd place, with two first place votes.

Elizabethton still in 3rd with one first place vote

Hardin County still at 4 and Greeneville still at 5.

Haywood County still there at No. 6 and then we see Region 4 causing a ruckus..

Macon County and Stone Memorial now tied at 7th, they will be on a collision course until the end of the season.

Marshall County inches up one spot to 9th

And in 10th, making their debut this season is Northview Academy at 6-0. ALL THE WAY From Kodak Tennessee, they are members of Region 1. Still with Greeneville and Elizabethton to go this season, they went 4-6 a year ago and have only been playing varsity ball since 2015. They could lose every game from here on out and still post their first winning season in school history. The school from Sevier County is also home to one of the newest and largest Bucees stores, one that claims to be their "largest in the country"

Also note that Clay County was the 1A Runner Up last year and have won 4 straight.

Springfield vs Hendersonville

The Jackets, not having the year they wanted so far, will host a 2 loss Hendersonville who's only blemishes are Brentwood and Beech. All but guaranteed a spot in the playoffs in their 6 team Region, The Jackets will lean heavily on Senior Clarence Cobbins to sting the Commandos. They only need one more Region win to theoretically qualify.

Looking at Class 4A Region 6, this is who we would match up with in Round 1.
