Level 1 Assistant Referee Course

Course description

This course consists of three modules and is designed to provide basic information to allow you to act as an Assistant Referee at Rugby games.

Upon completion of this course, you will be certified as a USA Rugby Assistant Referee (AR) and can act in this role in domestic matches in accordance with USA Rugby policy. In the United States, ARs have traditionally been required to take the in-person Level 1 Referee class to act as more than a 'touch judge', but now completion of this USA Rugby course qualifies you.

Referees who have completed the Level 1 class may also act as ARs, however, as the Referee Level 1 class is not designed to cover touch law or the specific skill set needed by ARs, it is recommended that Referees complete this course before acting as an AR.
