Kevin Bethel is the School Safety Chief for the School District of Philadelphia and currently also serves on Governor Wolf's Juvenile Justice Reform Task Force. Bethel formerly served as the Deputy Police Commissioner for the City of Philadelphia and is known for his groundbreaking work creating Philadelphia's Police School Diversion Program.

Marcus Jarvis is the Outreach and Communications Associate of the Debt Free Justice Campaign at Juvenile Law Center. Marcus first came to the Juvenile Law Center as a youth advocate for Juveniles for Justice to share his own experiences in the system and to advocate for juvenile and criminal justice reform.

Malik Pickett, Esq, is a Staff attorney at Juvenile Law Center where he advocates to ensure that youth in the justice system receive services in their homes and communities, that they have access to high quality education, and that they have the opportunity for successful reentry after system involvement.
