#### **Accessing School:**

- Students will access the school through the Main Entrance.
  - School doors will open for students at 7:30AM
  - Breakfast will be provided from 7:30AM 8:15AM

#### **Driving / Drop Off / Walking:**

Visible personnel in Yellow Construction Vests as well as officers from the Stoneham Police Department will be present to direct vehicles for parking and student drop off. A digital display will also be visible as you drive up the driveway to communicate driving / parking instructions as described below.

- **Student Parking**: All student parking is in the lower lot. Parking attendants will direct students to spaces
