

New Student Questionnaire:

Each student has their own goals, reasons for pursuing a PhD, and vision of what their degree will look like. Please take a few minutes to help me better understand yours!

1: What are your current career aims?

2: What do you consider a “successful PhD?”

3: What type of work do you think goes into a PhD? What type of work do you consider to be most crucial to your long-term ambitions?

4: What kind of working hours do you expect, both in terms of time devoted to different aspects of the program (course work, research, TAing, etc) and when those hours are worked?

5: Which aspects of a PhD do you expect to be the most demanding? Where do you think you have the most room to grow?

6: What aspects of a PhD are you most looking forward to? What do you see as being your greatest strengths?

7: What do you expect from me, as your mentor?

8: If problems arise in our mentorship relationship, how do you think we should resolve them?

9: What is your proposed communication plan (meeting frequency and location; email or basecamp for questions; expected response times; are messages outside of work hours acceptable? Is texting acceptable, and if so, when?)

10: Confidentiality: Any sensitive issues that we discuss will be held in the strictest of confidence. Please list any issues that are off-limits for discussion:

11: What strategies do you have for maintaining your health and wellness? Where do you anticipate needing support in this domain?

12: I aim to foster an equitable and inclusive lab environment. Do you have any suggestions for practices that could help achieve this goal?

13: Do you have any general questions about graduate school or academic culture?

14: Do you have any access needs that you would like me to be aware of? Please note that: (1) you shouldn't feel pressured to share any of the reasons why you have these needs, and (2) it's always a good idea to register with [accessibility services](#) if you require specific accommodations.

Expectations of Research Supervision

Supervisors and graduate students often have differing supervision expectations. The supervisor and student should complete this scale independently and then compare their responses. Circle a number depending on whether you think the responsibility lies more with the supervisor or the student (e.g., 1 for fully supervisor's responsibility and 5 for fully student's responsibility). If you believe the responsibility should be jointly managed through conversation, circle a 3.
