## **Boston University Research Guide: Culture and Cuisine of New England**

<u>Cambridge Historical Commission</u> "maintains a public archive on the city's history. The collection focuses on the city's architectural and social history and contains information on all 13,000+ Cambridge buildings; it also includes thousands of historic photographs and maps as well as information on many individuals and organizations."

## **Cambridge Public Library:**

 The Cambridge Room: "Has nearly 200 collections, spanning the 17th to 21st Centuries, featuring the history of Cambridge. Most of the collections focus on the political and social history of the City and are particularly strong in the mid-20th Century to the present."

The library also provides access to books featuring local culinary history.
