Keywords: **(Calibri 12, Italic)** *A list of relevant keywords that represent the main topics of the research.*

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1. Introduction

(Calibri 12) This section briefly and clearly outlines the purpose behind writing the paper. The introduction provides the necessary context for readers to comprehend and assess the experiment conducted while presenting the study's rationale.

This section should:

- Clearly explain the nature and importance of the problem
- Review relevant previous studies in a synthesized manner
- Identify research gaps or limitations
- State the purpose, objectives, and contribution of the paper
- End the introduction with a clear statement of the study's contribution or novelty.

Citation Notes:

- Arrange citations **chronologically** (earliest to latest), separated by semicolons
- Use APA 7th Edition style in-text citations

Examples:

- Parenthetical: *(Borowitzka & Brown, 1974; Pollard & Wyn Jones, 1979)*
- Narrative: *Ellis and Minton (2003)*
- Multiple works, same author/year: *(Haque et al., 2005a,b)*

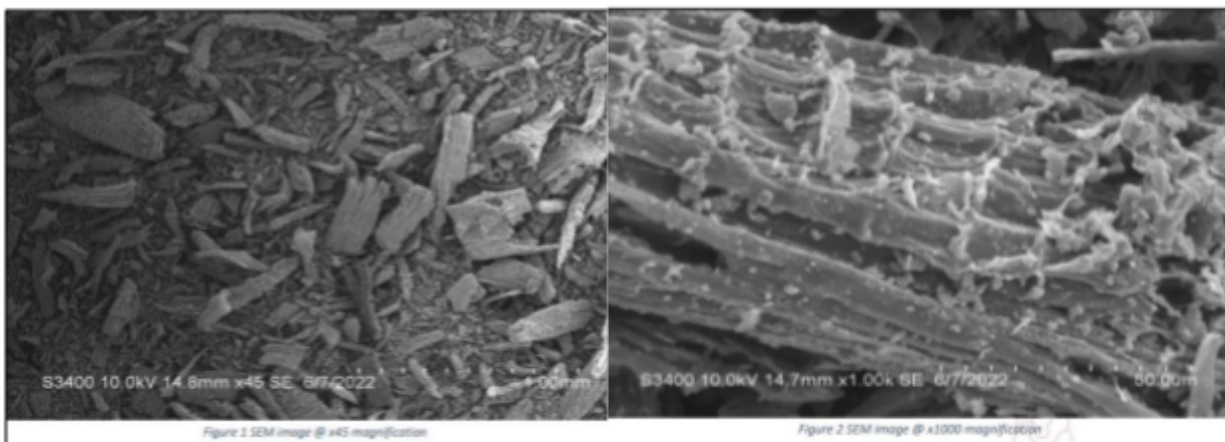
2.1. Subsection
