# WESLEYAN ENGAGED PROJECTS | CSPL/CGST480 Sponsor Expectations

Engaged Projects (EPs) are academic endeavors in which a student studies a topic of their choice and completes a final project intended for a non-academic audience. Full details are at <a href="http://engagedprojects.site.wesleyan.edu/">http://engagedprojects.site.wesleyan.edu/</a>.

EP students must enlist a volunteer Sponsor who will give advice and feedback throughout the semester. Sponsors can be Wesleyan alumni, community partners, or employees; family members or friends; professionals with related expertise; etc. Seeking, enlisting, and interacting with an appropriate Sponsor is a component of the EP learning experience.

We imagine that the best Sponsor matches will be those where there is reciprocal benefit; perhaps the Sponsor can use the student's research or project in their own work, they are interested in mentoring a young person, or they are retired and looking for meaningful ways to spend their time.

## Minimum Required Sponsor Commitments (5-10 hours)

### Kickoff meeting

Students will be prompted to schedule a meeting with their Sponsor to get to know them better, build rapport, walk through the schedule for the semester with them, and ask if they have any questions or advice at this stage. Students will be required to turn in their notes from this meeting.

### **Essay review**

Students will start the semester by researching their topic and writing a 5-page "explainer" essay, which they will send to their Sponsors. Sponsors are asked to share overall reactions and suggest additional research, learning, connections, or conversations that will help their student move forward productively.

#### **Project draft review**

EP students will complete a draft of their final project, which they will send to Sponsors. Sponsors are asked to give feedback, suggest additional contacts/partners, and provide any other advice that will help their student move forward productively.

### **End-of-semester wrap-up**

EP Sponsors will be invited to give feedback about about their experience and share advice for future EP students and Sponsors.

# **Optional Sponsor Activities**

Sponsor/student pairs may wish to schedule additional meetings throughout the semester.

After Sponsors give feedback on project drafts, EP students will make updates and send those "final" versions to their Sponsors . While Sponsor feedback is not required at that stage, it is welcome and appreciated.

After students officially launch/implement their projects, they will write a 2-page post-mortem documenting project outcomes, lessons learned, etc. They will send those write-ups to Sponsors. While Sponsor feedback is not required at that stage, it is welcome and appreciated.
