- Recognize inequities in society through reading novels and writing essays in the English curriculum. Like "To Kill a Mockingbird," "When the emperor was divine" involve deep thinking and analysis about inequities and justice.
- Discuss real problems in the classroom through the film analysis course. I remembered that my son showed me a funny short video they discussed in the class: In a Texas school, white students ignore a black student, the black student bullies a new transferred Asian kid, the Asian kid fights back...... Through the real case study, all students engage with problem-solving experiences.
- Promote the acceptance and celebration of all cultures through the annual World's Fair and Asian Fair. The most significant student-run events help students explore diverse cultural expressions through discussion, food, music, movies, and more.
