Social Media Marketing: Alex Tursi from Cultivate

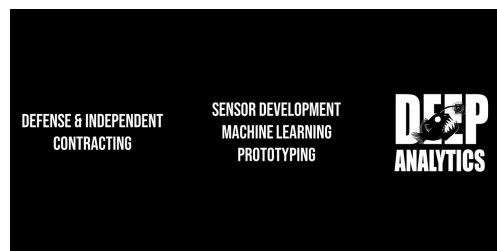

ASVAB Practice Test

For people who enlist in the military, the ASVAB test plays a huge role in determining their future. Your scores on the test determine which careers paths you are eligible for. On Friday, Nov. 21, someone from the military will be coming in to administer the ASVAB CEP, which is a practice test that will help you to get a sense of what careers you would be eligible for, and might suit you well. The scores on this test are not reported to the military, so it is low-stakes. Email heathermc@mpsvt.org if you would like to take this test. (She will also need to obtain parent permission.) We will have a session on Tuesday, Dec. 16 during W2 with someone from the military to help you to understand your scores and career possibilities.
