Year-wise expected outcomes from students

VIII. Providing Best Placement Opportunities

- Tie Your LACES (TYL) program which focuses on professional competency of students. TYL focuses on Language, Aptitude, Core domain, Experiential and Soft skills, along with programming skills and industry relevant technologies. Conduction of Hackathons to help students gain competitiveness. The training is provided right from the first year. Continuous evaluation of the skills is done and a TYL score card is tracked for each student.
- TYL (Tie Your LACES) program on Language, Aptitude, Core (Programming – P1 to P4, Core domain – C2 to C5), Experiential and Soft-skills.
- Top-notch companies during campus placements
- Special sessions on guidance of higher studies
- Special coaching for competitive exams

All TYL topics are categorized into: - Lx for Language skills, Ax for Aptitude skills, Cx for Core domain skills, Px for Programming skills, Sx for Soft skills, Bx for fundamental analytical skills and Dx for Business Domain Skills. Lx, Ax, Cx, Px and Sx are applicable to BE and MCA programs, whereas Bx and Dx are applicable to MBA programs.

All TYL Skills are developed in students from first year to final year in phases. For example, TYL A1 Aptitude is covered in first year BE, where TYL A2 covered in second year, A3 & A4 Aptitude training are planned in 5th & 6th semesters of BE. Similarly, Px topics are covered with TYL P2- C and P2- Python in 1st year BE, TYL P3-Python and P3-Java in BE 2nd year and TYL P4 trainings are planned in 3rd year. The TYL program is designed such that skill levels go up as students' progress in their coursework.

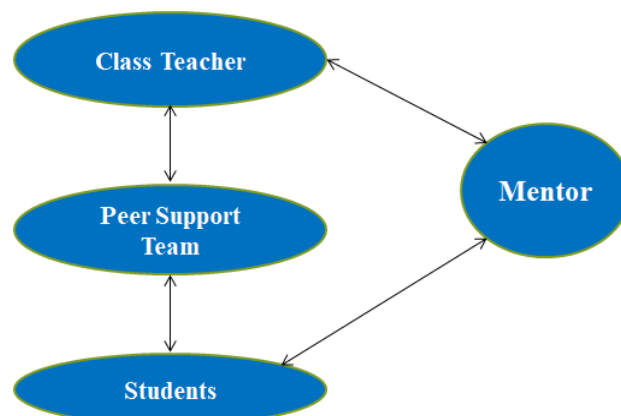
7. Student Transformation Record (STR)

At the CMR Institute of Technology, the Mentoring Process is one of the best practices. Every department has assigned 2 to 3 mentors to every class (average 60 students), such that there are 20-30 students under each mentor. Mentors maintain a record book for their mentoring / Counselling (STR Book - Student Transformation Record Book) which contains a complete database of a student. This record is maintained by mentors, and it contains student profile, TYL (Tie Your LACES) scorecard, career counselling worksheet, affiliated clubs, affiliated

professional bodies, events attended, MOOC record, mini-projects, participation in sports and other cultural activities, results and arrear records. This record is maintained throughout their BE program and hence it gives information about how a student has transformed into a Successful Professional in four years. The college has a professional counsellor, who visits every Friday and over the phone, every day, to help our students. Mentors interact with their mentees regularly during the afternoon (as per the college timetable every Wednesday and Thursday afternoon).

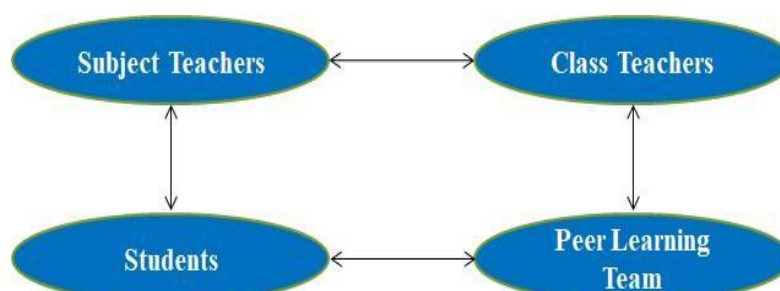
A. Peer Support Team (PST)

10. Students can retain the books for 10 days only, after which a fine of Rs.1/- per book per day will be charged.
11. The reader must check the condition of books while borrowing, in case the books are found damaged, mutilated or spoilt while returning, the reader has to replace the same as a new book.

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12. Renewals are allowed only when there is no claim by others and A borrowed book if recalled by the librarian must be returned immediately.
 13. Online reservation can be made for a book, which is already lent out. Reserved books are kept separately in the circulation counter for two days for each member.
 14. Maintain a Queue at the circulation counter.
 15. A suggestion box is kept in the counter where the readers can suggest their requirements.
 16. Suggestions for purchasing books for the library and improving library facilities are appreciable.

Internal Assessment Test (IAT)

For internal evaluation, the institution conducts 2 internal assessment tests for every course every month and the average of all the three performances will be considered. Marks are also allocated for assignments and quizzes. This ensures continuous evaluation of the students. The process followed by the Institute for internal evaluation is like the university is as given below.

- The exam committee is set up to ensure that internal tests are conducted appropriately, uniformly and transparently. The internal exams are conducted in a proper way by preparing timetables for each internal exam.
- All the course instructors prepare the question papers ensuring the coverage of course outcomes and bloom's taxonomy levels.
- The scheme of evaluation is uploaded by the faculty after the completion of internal exams. Internal marks are also uploaded in the ERP.
- Internal Assessment Test for 2022 & 2025 Scheme
 - For IAT-I, approximately 50% of syllabus is covered
 - For IAT II, approximately 50% of syllabus is covered

A minimum of 85% attendance is mandatory to appear for the IAT and SEE examinations.

Instructions

- No entry without an ID Card.
- All the candidates should take possession of their seats 10 minutes before the commencement of the IAT.
- The candidates should not take any books, cellphones, programmable calculators, smart watches or any kind of reference materials into the examination hall. If found will be disqualified from the remaining IAT.
- Candidates should use only black ballpoint pens for IAT.
- The candidates should write his Name, USN/Roll number, subject and subject code on the answer Booklet.
- As per VTU rules passing internal marks for 2022 & 2025 scheme theory (20/50) and for lab (20/50).

End Sem. Exam

- The examination for the theory as well as practical courses is held at the end of the semester as per the timetable given by the university.

- Generally, the duration of the end sem exam is 3 hours, but it may vary for certain Courses.
- Hall ticket during the examination is compulsory for the end semester exam which can be collected from the department priory.

All university examinations (SEE) shall be conducted for a maximum of 100 marks. For assigning the letter grade the university examination marks secured by a student, except in case of serial no. 07 and 09 shall be reduced to 50 marks to add the same with CIE marks. If a fraction results during reduction, it shall be rounded off to higher value.

Examination Rules

- The student must have a minimum of 85% attendance in theory and practical of the respective course.
- Students must read the scheduled timetable of examinations carefully and check regularly, changes made in the timetable if there are any.

- Students must be present in the examination hall twenty minutes before the start of the examination.
 - The student should obey the instructions given by the invigilator in the examination hall.
 - Students should not speak or communicate in any way with any other candidate in the examination hall during the examination.
 - Exchange of writing materials, mathematical instruments etc, is strictly prohibited
 - Students must not enter an examination hall more than half an hour after the start of an examination.
 - Students must not carry notes, blank papers, books, programmable calculators, mobile phones or any other electronic data storage device with them during the examination. All rough work must be done in the exam booklets provided during the examination
 - A warning bell will be given five minutes before the closing of the examination; at the second bell students must stop writing and be ready to hand over the answer-books to the invigilator. Students must not leave the seat until all answer-books are collected by the invigilator.
