Sermon: (Please be seated)

We respond to God's Word: (Minister and People together, all standing)

A: I believe in God, the Father almighty,

creator of heaven and earth.

I believe in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord.

He was conceived by the power of the Holy Spirit and born of the Virgin Mary. He suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried. He descended to the dead.

³ The peace of Christ is not just a pleasant sentiment: it is a declaration of reality. Christ himself is our peace, and it is in him, and through him that we are reconciled to God and to one another.

⁴ The offering of money and food are tokens of our lives, representing our work, our play, our families, our communities, and our very selves. We place all that we are, all we have, and all we do into Christ's hands.

⁵ These words communicate the reality of Jesus' presence in the community of believers. Jesus said that "when two or three are gathered in my name, there am I in their midst" (Mt 18:20).

He chose to bear our griefs and sorrows, and to give up his life on the cross, that he might shatter the chains of evil and death, and banish the darkness of sin and despair. By his resurrection he brings us into the light of your presence. Now with all creation we raise our voices to proclaim the glory of your name.

⁶ We believe that Jesus is present as we share in communion. In some mysterious way we feed on him in this act. Jesus said "this is my body" and "this is the cup of my blood". This is more than a symbol, but we should also be wary of trying to define too clearly how this works.

What is Lent?

The season of Lent finds its origins in the practice of early converts to Christianity spending time preparing for baptism at Easter through increased spiritual intensity. The weeks before Easter became an especially intense time of prayer, fasting, study, and renunciation of sin, in preparation for their new lives as Christians. Lent is a time of renewed commitment and self-discipline. Many give up certain foods and luxuries in remembrance of how much Christ gave up for us. Many also dedicate more time to prayer, study, or acts of charity and generosity. It is a time of spiritual spring cleaning.

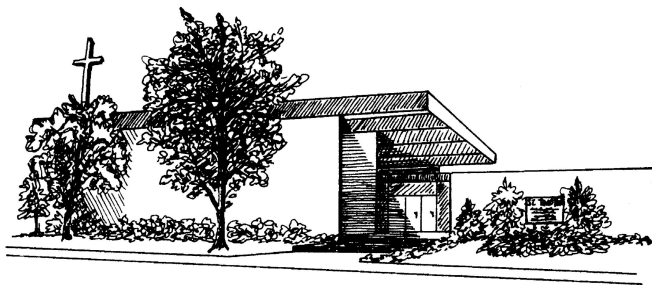
