Happy Friday! What a beautiful week we had. Here is a quick snapshot of what we covered:

Eureka 4: (Grade 4, Module 5)

- **Lesson 14:** Solve word problems involving the addition of measurements in decimal form.

ELC:

 Students are embarking on a second round of self-directed Literature circles - in which they plan reading schedules and meeting content. We are wrapping up our autobiographies and embarking on our next essay in which will identify connections between the author's life & work. Our spelling theme for this upcoming week is Trigraphs.

Benchmark:

- We continued our 5th unit: Technology for a Green Future
 - Our essential question for this unit is How do we make decisions about developing new technology?
- We read "Town Tackles Energy Debate," and discussed the difference between a Solar Power plant and a Natural Gas Plant and how they would both help the town of Hopeville.

• We also read about "Green Transportation Solutions," and discussed Green Cars like Hybrid Cars and Battery powered Cars and Renewable Fuels like biodiesel and ethanol.

Social Studies:

• We learned about St. Augustine, Florida & Maryland's first settlement at St Mary's City.

All 4th graders will have nightly math and reading homework. We encourage you to set up a homework spot in your home that is stocked with pencils so that your 4th grader is ready to review the day's math concepts. Your child should be reading 20 minutes every night. Math homework goes along with the eureka lessons listed above. Any homework assigned in Science, Social Studies, or Health will be assigned at the teachers discretion.
