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AREA STATEMENT OF PURPOSE

AREA ASSEMBLIES serve the following purposes:

- To provide support, guidance and information for GSRs of individual groups, as well as Districts
- To maintain communication links between members and AA as a whole
- To support and encourage the health of the conference structure and, by the same token, for growth and harmony of our beloved Fellowship
- To suggest, discuss and plan means of carrying the message to those alcoholics still suffering in the Area community
- To elect and support a Delegate for conference who can act as the voice of A.A. groups within our Area
- To learn first-hand, via our Area delegate, what is happening in A.A. Australia and World Services.

These goals are achieved through discussion, workshops, visits by guests from other AA service areas, sharing group problems, etc. The emphasis shall always be on peace and harmony within the fellowship and generating more activity among Members, Groups, Intergroups, Districts, etc.
