ATLANTIC IVY

What is Atlantic ivy? Atlantic ivy is a noxious weed that grows on the **western side of the Cascades**. Atlantic ivy is a very **invasive** plant that takes over the space of native plants. If you find it make sure to **remove** the stems from all around the trunk. Large vines can be **cut using an axe or pruning saw**. It is only **mildly poisonous** if eaten.
