

Canvas Grading Schemes

In addition to the default grade scheme, Canvas users can create course and assignment level grading schemes. Course-level grade schemes will change the overall final course grade scheme. Assignment-level grade schemes are only applied to selected individual assignments.

Exploring Different Grading Schemes

At the course-level, the disproportionate 100-point scale may be adjusted by setting a percentage such as 50 as the minimum grade. This configuration makes “gradations of the letter scale more proportionate... [requiring] the same degree of improvement from an F to a D as we would require to move from a B to an A” (Feldman, 2019, pp.84-85). Alternatively, the 0-4 grading scale simplified letter grade correlation to a single digit number.

Apply Grade Schemes to Individual Assignments

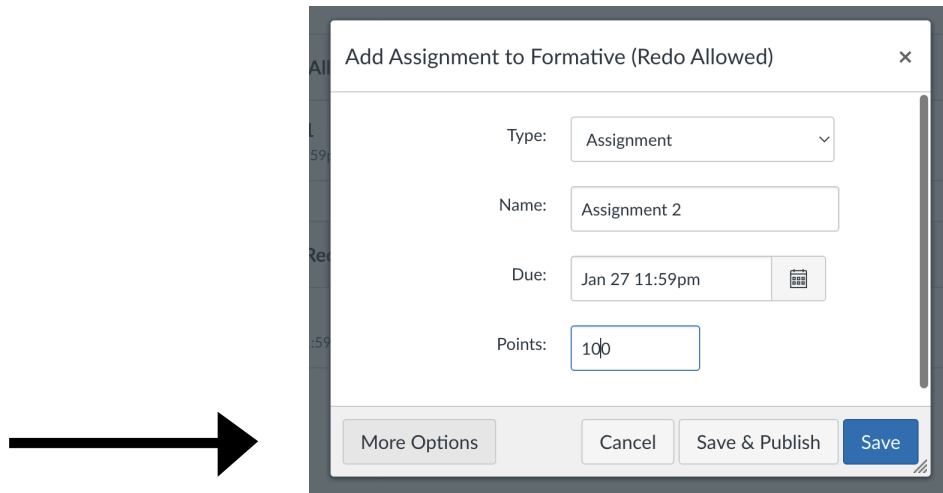
Select Assignments in the course navigation menu. Go to the assignment group, and select the plus (+) sign to create a new assignment or edit an existing assignment.

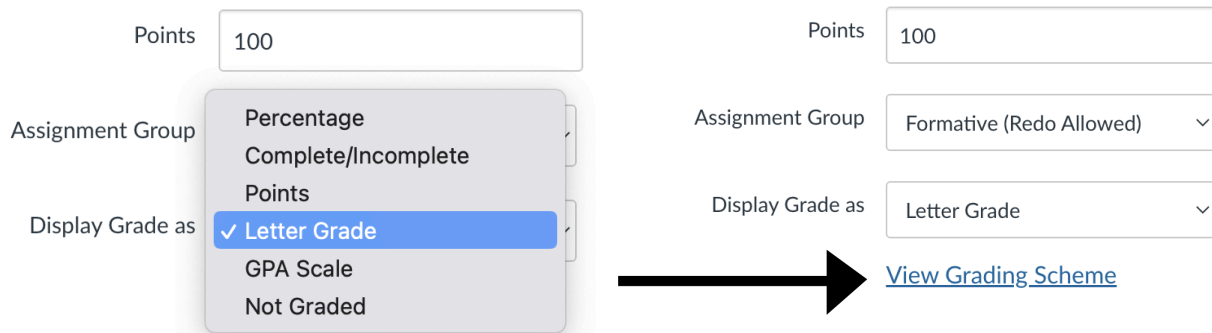
