ASC Presentation

Key Takeaways

- Significant increase in aerial participation: FFSP competitors up from 125 to 234, FIS points list athletes up from 22 to 39
- Focus on hosting more scored events to get athletes on points lists while maintaining some non-scored events for beginners
- Discussions around optimizing event scheduling, locations, and formats to maximize participation and development opportunities
- Need to balance growing the sport at grassroots level while providing pathways for high-level progression (e.g. doubles)

Topics

Aerial Participation Growth

- FFSP competitors increased from 125 in 2024 to 234 in 2025
- FIS points list athletes grew from 22 to 39, with goal of 55 for next season
- Scored events increased from 5 to 10, while non-scored decreased from 5 to 2
- Goal to have 3-5 non-scored and 10-15 scored events next season
- 221 athletes on Eastern non-scored list out of 490 total mogul skiers (~45% participation)

Event Planning and Scheduling

- Discussions around optimizing Noram schedule and locations (e.g. Bristol, UOP, Lake Placid)
- Potential to host "Olympic celebration" event at Bristol Jan 31-Feb 1
- UOP may host selection event in mid-December (15-18th) for World Cup spots
- Considering making summer UOP event the official "Nationals" to increase prize money
- Stratton offered to potentially build double kicker for a Noram finals event

Development Pathways

- Need to balance grassroots participation (spreads/neutrals) with high-level progression (doubles)
- Limited facilities for training/competing doubles narrows pipeline quickly



- Discussed ways to make events more accessible/appealing (e.g. combining with moguls)
- Importance of exposing mogul skiers to aerials for overall freestyle development

Judging and Scoring Considerations

- Debate around scoring spreads/neutrals vs only flipping tricks
- Non-scored events still tracked on Eastern points list
- Exploring options for remote judging to reduce costs
- Using 2-3 judges for most development level events currently

Next Steps

- Work with Lake Placid to finalize potential Noram dates/plans
- Connect with Bristol about hosting Olympic-themed event Jan 31-Feb 1
- Confirm UOP selection event details for mid-December
- Explore making summer UOP event the official Nationals
- Continue efforts to host more aerial events in conjunction with mogul competitions
- Look into ways to reduce event costs (e.g. remote judging, shared resources)

Action Items

- Reach out to potential athlete reps for ASC committee. Target former athletes within 10yr window.
- Work w/ comp services dept to explore alternatives to head tax for aerial events (e.g. flat fee for sportive areas list)
