The financial wellbeing of our church is central to our mission. How we support our exciting ministries, what this campus looks like, and how our space is arranged will shape our ministry and mission for years to come. There are three different ways people can contribute. They are:

- The Annual Stewardship Campaign

Annual Stewardship

Stewardship is the regular practice of returning to God a portion of all that God has given to us. It is simply the act of being a steward, guided by grace, not guilt. Each fall, we are asked to discern what our personal, annual stewardship pledge can be for the following year. Our Stewardship ministry then uses these pledges to determine the church's operating budget for the next year to support staffing and programs. In addition to sustaining and expanding the mission and ministry of our church, a portion of this giving goes to fund the mission and ministry of the national UCC.

This year's annual stewardship drive, "**Because of YOU our church changes lives.**", will be led by Mary Jane and Hugh Tyler, Jennifer Elliot, and Anne Kimball. It will begin after the Capital Campaign ends October 15.

Capital Campaign

Unlike our annual stewardship program, our Capital Campaign is a once-in-every-twenty-five-years opportunity to raise an offering above and beyond regular giving. These dollars are typically used for large construction or rehabilitation of buildings. Our

capital campaign, "Be Boldly Bountiful!" is raising funds to support multiple projects that will sustain and enhance our campus and will allow us to support our Immigration mission.

Planned Giving
