The Serenity Seekers Beginners Meeting is a place for us to come together and share our collective experience, strength, and hope. Our primary objective is to maintain a secure and nurturing environment that fosters recovery – to do that, everyone here has the right to experience a safe and protected space.

Any person with a desire to stop drinking is welcome at this group. However, Tradition One states that “Our common welfare should come first; personal recovery depends upon A.A. unity”, and it is this Group’s Conscience that if any person endangers another individual or disrupts the group’s efforts to carry the message of AA, the Group Conscience or its elected representatives may ask that person to leave the meeting.

Predatory behaviours and unwelcome advances of a sexual nature are fundamentally incompatible with the principles of carrying the message of recovery. Such conduct will not be tolerated.

A.A. does not offer medical advice or detox services; the organisation refrains from taking positions on external matters, including medication. Any medical guidance should be sought from qualified healthcare professionals.

A.A. groups operate autonomously and do not have a governing body or central authority which oversees us. This meeting is run by you, for you.

If at any point concerns regarding your safety arise, please reach out to a sponsor, fellow group members, a trusted friend, or a professional to address the matter. And please do not hesitate to contact us **immediately** if you feel that your safety during this meeting has been compromised by anyone in attendance.
