## Session I The Science of Reading- What does the Research Say and Why is it Important for FSL Teachers to Know?

- examine the reading process, its complexity, and how various elements of the reading process work together to achieve reading comprehension.
- research-based models will be shown and explained
- Using the Simple View of Reading model, participants will look at real-life student case studies and determine each students' learning profile and area of need in the reading process.
- Participants will be invited to share their findings and how they used the Simple View of Reading to determine the learning profile of each student.

## Session 2 The Science of Reading: Scarborough's Reading Rope and Word Recognition

- reflect on how the Simple View of Reading model was used to develop a learning profile for their students
- unravel and discuss each strand of Scarborough's Reading Rope, with a focus on Word Recognition.
- participants will watch demonstrations of how to teach phonemic awareness and phonics using Code Packs. Each participant will be provided with a phonics scope and sequence and encouraged to make a Code Pack of their own

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## Session 3: The Science of Reading: Resources to Support a Structured Literacy Approach in the Second Language Classroom and Next Steps on your SOR Journey

- review the key learnings from previous sessions
- participants will be invited to demonstrate how to use code packs in their FSL classroom
- sharing tools, resources and strategies that educators can use in order to implement a Structured Literacy approach to support reading AND writing in a second language.
- participants will leave this session with a "toolbox" of new ideas, resources and strategies to help struggling readers learn to read and write in French
- Participants will be provided with a list of books, articles, and workshops to explore if they wish to continue their Science of Reading learning journey.
