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School attendance

It is unlawful for any minor under the age of 18 to be "absent from school and found in a public place," idling, wandering, strolling, playing, or aimlessly driving or riding about in or upon any public street, avenue, highway, road, curb area, alley, park, playground, or other public ground, public place of a public building, place of amusement or eating place, vacant lot or unsupervised place, or any place open to the public during school days and or hours (Education Code Section 48200).

Documentation to verify reason(s) for absence must be provided within three (3) school days after the student returns to school to prevent absences from being recorded as uncleared/unexcused and counting towards truancy!

Excused Absences - Excused California Education Code Section 48205 provides that a student shall be excused from school when the absence is due to

- Illness or injury (Student)
- Medical, dental, optometric, or chiropractic services, mental health services
- Attending the funeral of an immediate family member
- Appearance in court
- Attendance at an educational conference offered by a non-profit organization (legislative/judicial)
- Attendance at a religious retreat (shall not exceed four (4) hours per semester)
- Medical exclusion or exemption or religious instruction
- Revoked suspension through the appeals procedure.
- Attending the pupil's naturalization ceremony

Unexcused Absences

Unexcused Absences for which no explanation is provided or absences for reasons other than those listed as **EXCUSED ABSENCES** (above) may be considered unexcused. Students with unexcused absences will be classified as truant

Examples of UNEXCUSED absences include:

- Running errands for the family
- Babysitting
- Vacations or trips
- Transportation problems
- On permit/living out of the district!

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Tardy and Tardy Sweeps

- Students who arrive at school after 09:00 am will be identified as truant. These students must get a tardy pass from Dr. Barbour or Dr. Kenning before entering the classroom. RTI will call the parent.
- Students arriving at periods 2-6 tardy will not receive a Tardy pass. These
 students will be counted as tardy and assigned campus beautification, and
 Tardy sweeps will happen Monday through Friday after lunch. Students caught
 in the tardy sweep will be given campus beautification and placed on the no-go
 list, and RTI will call the parent.

Any student absent from school and tardy or absent more than 30 minutes on three (3) occasions in one school year without a valid excuse or any combination thereof is truant. Upon a student being classified as truant, the school/district will inform the parent/guardian) of the following:

- That their child has been identified as truant.
- That the parent/guardian is obligated to compel the pupil's attendance at school
- That parent/guardian who fails to meet these obligations may be guilty of an infraction and subject to prosecution.
- Alternative educational programs are available.
- That the parent/guardian has the right to meet with appropriate school personnel to discuss solutions to the student's truancy
- That it is recommended that the parent/guardian accompany the pupil to school and attend classes with the pupil for one (1) day (shadowing)

Truancy notification

 A truancy notification letter will be mailed to parents/guardians of students between the ages of 6 and 18 years when students accumulate three (3) or more unexcused absences, early leaves, and tardiness of 30 minutes or more in the school year if a valid excuse has not been provided within three (3) instructional days of an absence!

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Tier 1 supports all students

TARDIES

1-5 Tardies

- Teacher conference with student
- Daily automated phone notification to the student's parent or guardian for each tardy

6-9 Tardies

Teacher contacts home

At the 10th Tardy

- Teacher submits referral to RTI for Tier II supports.
- RTI will place student on SART contract.
- If student's tardies do not improve, student will be sent to SARB and Saturday School and placed on the "No-Go" list.

ABSENCES

1-5 Absences (Truant)

- Teacher meets with student and contacts the student's parent or guardian.
- Daily automated phone call to report absence

6th Truancy

- Teacher submits referral to RTI.
- RTI will place student on SART contract.
- If student's attendance does not improve, student will be sent to SARB and placed on the "No-Go" list.

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Bathroom passes

- 1. Students will not be allowed to take their cell phones with them to the bathroom. The student going to the bathroom must leave their phone in class with the teacher.
- 2. Students cannot use a bathroom pass to see the nurse.
- 3. Students should not spend more than 8-10 minutes in the bathroom. Students who violate the policy will be placed on restriction.
- 4. Students wandering around the campus on their cell phones with a bathroom is prohibited!
 - 1st offense: Student returned to class and placed on bathroom restriction for seven days; RTI will contact the student's parents!
 - 2nd offense: Student returned to class and was placed on bathroom restriction for two weeks; RTI will contact the student's parents!
 - 3rd offense: Student brought to RTI or administrator.

 Bathroom restriction until the end of the semester or the school year's end.

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Leuzinger cell phone policy

Cell phones must remain out of sight and off during the instructional day. Students can only use their cell phones on school grounds before, during lunch, and after school. Cell phone use is prohibited in classrooms, during testing or assessment, or when traveling to or in restrooms and school offices. Students will be subject to disciplinary action if their use of their cell phones disrupts the school's educational environment. The school and its staff are not responsible for damaging or stealing a student's cell phone. Violations of the Leuzinger Cell Phone Policy will result in the following:

- First offense: The student's parents will be contacted and informed of the
 refusal to follow the school's cell phone policy. The student's cell phone will be
 confiscated by a staff/security member and held in the RTI or admin office
 until the end of the school day.
- Second offense: The student's cell phone will be confiscated and held in the RTI or admin office until the end of the school day. The student will be assigned three days of campus beautification and prohibited from bringing their cell phone to school for a week. If the student must bring their cell phone to school, it must be surrendered to the RTI or Admin before the start of period one and picked up after school.
- Third offense: The student's cell phone will be confiscated and held in the RTI office until the student's parents pick it up. The student will receive five days of campus beautification and will be prohibited from bringing their cell phone back to school for two weeks. If the student must bring their cell phone to school, it must be surrendered to the RTI or Admin before period one and picked up after school.

Students who refuse to surrender their cell phones will be escorted to an administrator.

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Vape pens, marijuana, and paraphernalia are prohibited!

Preventive practices will be put in place!

- The Admin, RTI, and Campus Security will utilize drug dogs.
- Word of mouth
- Teacher or staff information!

Students caught with VPs, drugs, or paraphernalia.

- RTI or Admin will contact the student's parent or guardian.
- The student will receive or take part in mandatory drug counseling.
- CICO weekly meeting with RTI
- Students will be considered for expulsion.

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Dress code 2023-2024

The school dress code will be enforced without regard to gender.

- 1. No one can have bare midriff or see-through garments.
- 2. Clothes must be sufficient to conceal undergarments. See-through tops and bare abdomens are prohibited.
- 3. Clothing, jewelry, and personal items shall be free of writing, pictures, or any other insignia which is vulgar, lewd, obscene, profane, or sexually suggestive or which promotes the use of alcohol, drugs, tobacco, or other illegal activity.
- 4. Students shall be allowed to wear sun-protective clothing, including but not limited to hats, for outdoor use during the school day.
- 5. Students shall not wear clothing that presents a health or safety hazard or causes a substantial disruption to the educational program.
- 6. Students are prohibited from wearing gang-related apparel.
- 7. Appropriate shoes must be worn at all times.

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RTI Interventions to address negative behavior

- CICO (Check in Check out): (PBIS) The CICO Program is a school-wide, check-in, check-out prevention program for students who are starting to engage in problem behavior. The CICO program aims to prevent students from acting out from escalation and provide more frequent feedback on their behavior to avoid future problem behavior.
- SST (Student Success Team): SST is a School Site Team meeting that includes the parent, the student, and the RTI (behavior/intervention specialist). This team aims to identify possible solutions to improving the student's attendance or behavior. Failure to attend this meeting or abide by what is outlined in the SART will result in a referral to the district School Attendance Review Board SARB.
- SART (Student Attendance Contract). If the student does not follow the stipulations in the SART, the student may be referred to a School Attendance Review Board (SARB).
- SARB (Students Attendance Review Board): SARBs Director is directly connected to the district attorney's office and can schedule hearings regarding truancy/ poor behavior in school. Meetings are held at the district offices. Failure to comply with SARB is an infraction, and the parents may be fined up to \$2,000.
- Recommendation for alternative placement
- Home visits by the RTI team or law enforcement.

- 30+ unexcused class absences
- 10 consecutive school days
- 12+ unexcused tardy
- Caught in the tardy sweep

- 2+ Fs on Report Card
- 2+ Us in Cooperation/ Work Habits

Behavior:

- 2+ Cell Phone offenses
- 1 Disciplinary Referrals

FOOD DELIVERY/FOOD DROP OFF

Students are prohibited from ordering food deliveries or for parents to drop off food during the school day. Food deliveries will not be accepted by Leuzinger staff. Students lose instructional time, and disruptions to school operations arise due to food deliveries ordered by students.
