

The differences is the red circling the roman numeral, in this case it is 1. The species is under the differences, in this case the red circling the number 4. Now that we know the genus, which is trans. General or just general, the difference which is 1, and the species which is 4, we can draw the figure. However species 4 refers to NAME. To refer to PERSON, we add a circle or "o" to the left end of the figure.
