## **Agenda Items**

#### **Social/Emotional Learning**

Nikki Chan welcomed everyone to the meeting and presented a powerpoint on RSU 24's Social/Emotional Learning, SEL, program for K-8 students. She then explained how the Maine Guiding Principles are set through the legislature, and RSU24 is required to teach them through our curriculum. Nikki shared a presentation that included lesson titles, content, and skill sets for grades K-5 SEL and explained how grades 6-8 SEL expanded on that base. Within her presentation, she showed an overarching chart explaining why it is important to implement SEL, and showed a breakdown of how students fare with a SEL

program *vs* no SEL program in a school. She then went on to explain why and how the 2020-2021 SMHS program came together. Last year it was taught during Tiger Time but due to the schedule constraints of 2021-2022, SEL would not be taught this year at the High School. The meeting was then opened up to questions and comments from the committee and community.

The committee thanked Nikki for the clarification and explained why they had wanted SEL as an agenda item. A discussion was then had with community members over their concerns about topics from last year, how necessary the learning is compared to a focus on traditional learning (reading/math).

A motion was made to direct Nikki to start exploring SEL programs for grades 9-12 but was quickly retracted as a motion was not needed. The committee did instruct Nikki to start looking into SEL programs for 9-12 (which is a different approach than the home-grown lessons from 2020-2021).

As the conversation ended, the committee chair, Janet, noted that everyone had been heard and any additional issues should be addressed with Mr. Green and Mr. Dube, Mr. Eastman, Mrs. Chan or herself. She thanked everyone for sharing their concerns.
