Our selection committee decides the first round which will be based on your application as well as any interactions that you have had with our membership. You will be contacted by **September 4, 2025** if you are selected to continue to the second round of the recruitment process. If selected, we will schedule you for an in-person interview from **September 5th - 7th**. The second and final selection will be decided by our general membership and will be based on a cumulative evaluation including your interview.
