60 Degree Table Topper



Material Needed:


- A. 5 strips 2½" x WOF (width of fabric)
- B. ²/₃yd. for backing and binding
- C. Batting to fit the size of table topper
- Sew 5 strips of fabric lengthwise in the order you want to see in the table topper (Note: the patterns will alternate due to using the 60 degree triangle)



- 2. Press seams to go all one direction
- 3. Next use the 60 degree ruler and line up the top to be flush to the fabric and trim to the left side of the triangle



4. Take the excess away and trim to the right side of the ruler to create your first triangle



5. Next take the flat point and face it towards you to cut your next triangle

6. Repeat steps 4&5 down the strip of fabric to get 6 triangles

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7. Next lay out your table topper



8. You will sew 3 triangles together and create 2 halves

 a. The seams should nest together allowing the seams to line up when sewing



After you sew the two halves together, pin the halves right side together, lining up seams



10. Press seams

11. Quilt and bind as desired
