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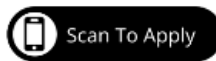


# SCHOLARSHIP APPLICATION



### Eligibility Requirements for Mentees:

- Must be a high school senior mentee
- Participated in TeamMates for a minimum of 3 years
- Must utilize the scholarship beginning in the fall of 2026
- Mentees may apply one time up until the age of 25
- **Application deadline is January 20<sup>th</sup>, 2026**

The free application period for the NU system is August 1st - November 1st! The code will depend on which website the students use to complete the application on:

- If starting the app on UNO's website, the code is MAVERICKS
- If starting the app on UNL's website, the code is HUSKERS
- If starting the app on UNK's website, the code is LOPERS

However, I wouldn't tell students to stress about which code they use too much, as long as something is typed in the fee waiver code box at the end of the application, their fee will be waived. Please let me know if you have additional questions!

## Nebraska First Responder Pledge

The **Nebraska First Responder Pledge** demonstrates the University of Nebraska–Lincoln's commitment to Nebraska law enforcement officers, firefighters, firefighter-paramedics, and their dependent children by waiving in-state tuition after calculating other scholarships and grants.

## Nebraska Promise

The **Nebraska Promise** covers tuition—not including housing and food—for students with family incomes of \$65,000 or less (AGI) or those who are Pell Grant-eligible. Students will automatically be considered once they submit their complete application and the FAFSA Form. Students should submit the FAFSA Form by June 1, 2026 for consideration.

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## Husker Hub is Here to Help

At **Husker Hub**, students and families can get assistance with the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA), scholarships, grants, student/parent loans, enrollment verification, student bills and work-study jobs as they plan their path toward graduation.

After they have applied to Nebraska, students can use their NUID to log in to meet 1-to-1 with a full-time Student Services Specialist remotely Monday through Friday from 10 a.m.–4 p.m. CT through the **virtual drop-ins**. No appointment necessary.

KEARNEY HEALTH OPPORTUNITIES PROGRAM

The Kearney Health Opportunities Program (KHOP) is a cooperative program between the University of Nebraska at Kearney and the University of Nebraska Medical Center. The purpose is to recruit high school students from rural Nebraska and prepare them to return and practice healthcare in rural Nebraska. To apply, you must have [applied and been admitted](#) to UNK. Access the online application below and click on "Admitted Incoming Freshmen." The KHOP application deadline is **December 1**.

**Note:** In order to be considered for KHOP, a minimum ACT composite score of 23 is required AND students must complete the science portion of the ACT. Superscores are not considered. [View full requirements.](#)



To be considered for RLOP, students must meet the following criteria:

Be a rural Nebraska resident. (Students from the following cities and towns are not considered rural and therefore not eligible to apply to RLOP: Omaha, Ralston, Boys Town, Elkhorn, Lincoln, Bellevue, Papillion, La Vista, Chalco, and Offutt Air Force Base.)

Have applied and been accepted to Wayne State College.

Demonstrate strong academic potential.

All materials must be sent to and received by WSC by Nov. 15, 2025, for application consideration for the 2026-27 school year.
