POSITION SUMMARY

Join our Facilities Team and bring color and craftsmanship to one of the most beautiful and unique settings in the region. As a Painter, you'll support the appearance and upkeep of a wide variety of spaces, including employee housing dorms, commercial kitchens, dining areas, office buildings, and public-facing resort spaces. This role includes both indoor and outdoor painting across multiple facilities situated in a mountain resort environment.

You'll work as part of a small, collaborative team (2–6 members depending on the project), and coordinate regularly with departments including Housing, Maintenance, and Events. Projects will vary from touch-ups to full-room repaints, to larger seasonal improvement projects, offering a diverse and rewarding work experience in a stunning natural setting.

ESSENTIAL DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES

The following statements are intended as general illustrations of the work in this classification and are not all-inclusive of the specific position.

- Plan, schedule, and coordinate painting projects in collaboration with department stakeholders.
- Prepare surfaces by cleaning, sanding, patching, or priming to ensure proper adhesion of finishes.
- Protect work areas using appropriate masking materials, drop cloths, or plastic sheeting.
- Apply paints, stains, varnishes, and other finishes using brushes, rollers, or sprayers in accordance with manufacturer recommendations and safety guidelines.
- Perform painting tasks both indoors and outdoors in various weather and terrain conditions.
- Work on painting assignments in diverse facility types, including employee dormitories, kitchens, restrooms, and administrative offices.
- Erect and safely work on scaffolding, ladders, and lifts as needed for elevated surfaces.
- Perform general maintenance and minor carpentry tasks in support of painting projects.
- Follow proper safety procedures and use personal protective equipment (PPE) as required.
- Maintain a clean and organized workspace and handle cleanup following each project.
- Effectively communicate progress, material needs, and timeline adjustments.
- Flexibly assist with other duties as assigned in support of broader facilities operations.

QUALIFICATIONS

- Ability to communicate clearly and professionally both verbally and in writing.
- Basic math and measurement skills required for surface area calculations and mixing ratios.
- Demonstrated ability to solve practical problems and adapt to changing site conditions.
- Ability to work at heights using ladders, scaffolds, or boom lifts in a safe and confident manner.
- Must be comfortable working indoors and outdoors in varying temperatures and terrain.
- This position requires you to carry company keys, so you must be able to pass a background check.

EDUCATION and/or EXPERIENCE

High School diploma or equivalent. Entry-level position – no prior painting experience required. Previous experience in general maintenance, facilities, or construction is a plus but not necessary.



How You'll Succeed

- 5. Serve First Put the needs of the community first, whether you're preparing a dorm room for new arrivals or making a shared space feel more like home.

PHYSICAL DEMANDS

This position requires regular physical activity and mobility. Painters must be able to stand, walk, bend, climb, reach, and work in awkward or confined spaces for extended periods. Frequent use of hands and fingers is required to operate tools and apply paint with precision. The role also involves lifting and carrying materials weighing up to 50 pounds regularly and up to 100 pounds occasionally. Work may be performed at heights using ladders (up to 24 feet), scaffolding, or boom lifts, and requires comfort with elevated and potentially uneven surfaces. Reasonable accommodations may be made to enable individuals with disabilities to perform the essential functions of the job safely.

WORK ENVIRONMENT

Work is performed both indoors and outdoors throughout the resort's varied facilities. The mountain environment includes changes in elevation, exposure to seasonal weather conditions (heat, cold, wind), and uneven or sloped terrain. Work is often scheduled to minimize disruption to guests and staff and may require flexibility to accommodate special events or operational needs. Protective equipment, training, and safety protocols will be provided to ensure a safe and supportive work setting.

To perform this job successfully, an individual must be able to perform each essential duty satisfactorily. The requirements listed are representative of the knowledge, skill, and/or ability required.
