CRIMES / INCIDENTS

Crimes recorded between 01/03/2026 and 31/03/2026.

North Queensferry – There were 5 crimes recorded during this period. This includes a culpable and reckless offence, assault and theft.

Inverkeithing – There were 39 crimes recorded during this period. This includes crimes of dishonesty, crimes of violence and failing to comply with court orders. This also includes 16 crimes for traffic offences.

Dalgety Bay/Hillend – There were 29 crimes recorded during this period. Some of the offences include theft by shoplifting, crimes of violence and driving offences.

Aberdour – There was 6 crimes reported for this period. This includes an assault, attempt theft of motor vehicle and theft by shoplifting.

Reviewing the crimes for this month there does not appear to be any crime reports impacting on the wider community.

CALLS TO POLICE

Dates: 01/03/2026 to 31/03/2026

46 calls relate to North Queensferry. Within this number, 11 calls relate to the village and are not connected to the motorway network.

124 calls relate to the Inverkeithing area.

33 calls relate to the Aberdour area.

85 calls relate to the Dalgety Bay/Hillend area.

Remainder of the calls were miscellaneous matters / information only

COMMUNITY WARD UPDATE

During the month, community officers have continued to assist Inverkeithing High school with the Mentors against violence prevention course.

Officers have arrested and charged a female who has committed numerous theft by shoplifting offences during the month. She was held in Police custody to appear at Dunfermline sheriff court the next lawful day.

Community officers, along with Police Scotland traffic officers, have conducted speed checks within Aberdour and North Queensferry due to recent reports of speeding within the villages. This will continue to be an area of focus.

We are looking to introduce “Coffee with a Cop” at locations in the ward area. The first session will be held at Sands a Place by the Sea on Monday 6th April between 1000 – 1200 hours. This is a chance to meet your local community officers and discuss any issues you may have.

Throughout the month, community officers have been conducting anti-social behaviour patrols at the weekends. This allows officers the chance to positively engage with younger members of society whilst ensuring ASB related incidents are kept to a minimum.
