

Parent Letter - Field Trips and Money collections

February 26, 2020

Dear High School Parents,

The purpose of this message is to clarify the TCIS policy on:

- 1. Trips
- 2. The collection of Money.

TCIS Trips - All approved schools trips shall be communicated through official letters on school letterhead and signed by Mr.Tom or Kru Rung. All previously approved trips are cancelled through the end of February due to the COVID-19 virus.

All Community Service trips follow the same TCIS Trip process. Community Service Hours must be pre-approved by the Thai Director, Kru Rung.

Money Collection - Any and all monies requested for approved trips, class dues, and approved fundraising shall be communicated through official letters on school letterhead and signed by Mr.Tom or Kru Rung.

If your child asks for money for a school trip or any fundraising activities at TCIS, please consider your approval only upon reading and understanding the information that is on official letterhead and signed by an authorized official of the school. Also, be reminded that even if a trip or request for money is approved by a school official on school letterhead, you have every right to make the decision best for your family and in no way should feel pressured by TCIS that your child contributes or participates in any activities.

As parents, your voice matters. Please be assured that TCIS desires to provide opportunities for all students and will communicate approved activities, including requests for money in writing on official letterhead signed by Mr.Tom or Kru Rung. Any documents or information you may be presented that do not contain an official signature from one of the above mentioned authorized individuals is not an approved activity of TCIS. This message is also shared with students and teachers.

ในกรณี ทัศนศึกษาเพื่อเก็บชั่วโมงจิตอาสา จะต้องมีการแจ้งขอตามระเบียบการขอออกนอก สถานศึกษาซึ่งมีการนำเสนอเรื่องให้กับมิสเตอร์ทอมโดยมีครูที่ปรึกษาเป็นผู้ดูแล และจะ ต้องได้รับการอนุมัติจากครูรุ้ง ผู้อำนวยการโรงเรียน

Coronavirus info (COVID-19)

CORONAVIRUS DISEASE 2019 (COVID-19)

WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW

This is a new coronavirus, first identified in Wuhan, China in December 2019.

TRANSMISSION Investigations are ongoing

- · Mainly spread by sick people through droplets created when they talk, cough and sneeze.
- Touching contaminated objects puts the infected droplets onto your hands which can enter your nose / eyes / mouth.



Travellers have spread the virus into other countries. Screening at entry points helps detect sick travellers.

Symptoms may appear within 14 days of probable exposure. Monitor your health!

- Sore throat
- Cough
- Shortness of breath
- Muscle aches
- Diarrhoea



Most cases are MILD, but some are SEVERE and can be fatal.



Seek immediate medical attention if you think you have been exposed or develop symptoms.

PREVENTION

Maintain good personal hygiene and ensure safe food practices:

- · Wash your hands frequently. Use alcohol-based hand sanitiser when soap and water are not readily available.
- Cover your coughs and sneezes.
- · Avoid touching your face.
- · Ensure food, including eggs, is thoroughly cooked.
- · Do not share food, drinks and personal items.

Avoid potential exposure:

- · Do not visit wet markets or farms.
- Avoid direct contact with animals (live or dead) and their environment.
- Do not touch surfaces that may be contaminated with droppings.
- Avoid contact with stray animals cats, dogs, rodents, birds and bats.
- Keep some distance from people who are obviously sick. Don't let them cough or sneeze on you.
- · Avoid activities where you are likely to be exposed to large groups of people.
- · Do not travel if you are sick.

Get the flu shot this will reduce the risk of seasonal flu and possible confusion with COVID-19 symptoms.

High School Art Happenings

Art 1 Dale Chihuly Inspired Compositions



During the last several weeks, Art 1 students have been looking at the art of American glass artist Dale Chihuly. Students used his elaborate works of art as an inspiration for their own original compositions. Students created several versions of their ideas before settling on one composition to render. They then worked with ratios, gridding and trace paper to enlarge their imagery. Students picked a color scheme and medium to use. Finally, utilizing shape and light effects from a previous unit, students were able to illuminate their compositions in order to create dimension and a level of realism within their chosen shapes.



21st-Century Libraries: The Learning Commons

Library Information

Libraries have existed since approximately 2600 BCE as an archive of recorded knowledge. From tablets and scrolls to bound books, they have cataloged resources and served as a locus of knowledge. Today, with the digitization of content and the ubiquity of the internet, information is no longer confined to printed materials accessible only in a single, physical location. Consider this: Project Gutenberg and its affiliates make over 100,000 public domain works available digitally, and Google has scanned over 30 million books through its library project.


Libraries are reinventing themselves as content becomes more accessible online and their role becomes less about housing tomes and more about connecting learners and constructing knowledge. Cushing Academy in Ashburnham, Massachusetts has been in the vanguard of this transition since 2009, when it announced its plans for a "bookless" library. A database of millions of digital resources superseded their 20,000-volume collection of books, and a café replaced the circulation desk. With this transition, not only did the way in which students consumed content change, but also how they utilized the library space. Rather than maintain a quiet location for individual study, the school wanted to create an environment for "collaboration and knowledge co-construction.'




