Disclaimer and Notes:

- This pattern was **assembled** by me rather than made, I did make/adjust some bits but for the most part, all the pieces in this pattern were sourced from other free patterns which you will find under the credits! I couldn't find a solid baphomet doll pattern for free that was written, clear, included all the parts, etc so I found different baphomet patterns for free as well as some other minor patterns to assemble this one!
- This pattern is written with US terms
- For the bits made with circular rounds, you can work in spirals or join the rounds depending on the look you want, I worked in spirals
- I hope this helps, sorry if the instructions aren't the clearest I did my best </3

Materials:

- Yarn: red and black yarn DK weight (or whatever weight and colors u want :3)
- Hook: 2.5mm (a 2.5mm hook with DK weight yarn made about a 5 inch/12.7 cm tall plush WITHOUT the horns and 8 inch/20 cm plush WITH horns! Feel free to use whatever size hook you want to best suit your yarn and the goal size of the plush)
- Other stuff:
 - o 10mm safety eyes (or bigger/smaller depending on desired plush size)
 - o Darning needle (metal recommended)
 - o Embroidery scissors
 - Sewing pins
 - Stitch markers
 - Polyfil stuffing or whatever stuffing:)

Terms:

- Ch Chain
- BLO Black loops only
- Dec Decrease (Invisible decrease recommended for working in circular rounds, regular sc2tog/decrease recommended for working in rows)
- Inc Increase
- MC magic circle
- Sc Single crochet
- Sc2tog Single crochet two together (Another word for a decrease)
- Sl st Slip stitch

- 1. Ch 7

- 3. 1 inc, 4 sc, 1 inc in each of the 3 sc cluster, 4 sc, 1 inc in each of the 2 sc cluster (20)
- 4. Sc around
- 5. Sc around
- 6. Sc around
- 7. Sl st, cut long tail

Ears x2 (red):

- 1. MC 6 sc (6)
- 2. 6 inc (12)
- 3. [1 sc, 1 inc] all around (18)
- 4. [2 sc, 1 inc] all around (24)
- 5. [3 sc, 1 inc] all around (30)

- 6. Sl st, cut long tail
- 7. Fold on a slant to create ear shape
- 8. Sew together the first few stitches of one folded end to keep shape

Horns x2 (black):

- 1. 16 ch (w a long tail for sewing on later), sl st into the 1st stitch to create a ring

Wings (angel look) x 2 (black) - these are what I used for my own project but you can use the dragon/bat wing pattern below this one instead if you'd like

- 1. Ch 6 (with long tail), turn
- 2. 4 sc starting w 2nd chain from hook, sl st, turn (5)
- 3. Ch 1 (not a stitch, just for height), 2 sc (don't sc into the sl st, sc into the first sc after the sl st), 1 inc, 1 sc, ch 4, turn (9)
- 4. 4 sc starting w 2nd chain from hook, 1 inc, 2 sc, sl st, turn (9)
- 5. Ch 1 (for height), 2 sc (don't sc into the sl st, sc into the first sc after the sl st), 1 inc, 5 sc, ch 4, turn (13)
- 6. 8 sc starting w 2nd chain from hook, 1 inc, 2 sc, sl st, turn (13)
- 7. Ch 1 (for height), 2 sc (don't sc into the sl st, sc into the first sc after the sl st), 1 inc, 9 sc, ch 4, turn (17)
- 8. 12 sc starting w 2nd chain from hook, 1 inc, 2 sc, sl st, fasten off

Wings (dragon or bat look) x 2 (black or red, note these are like twice the size of what the angel wings would be)

- 1. Ch 22, turn
- 2. Sc in the 3rd chain from hook, 19 sc, turn (20)
- 3. Ch 1, sc2tog, sc in the next 15sts, sc2tog, leave the last st unworked, turn (17)
- 4. Ch 1, sc2tog, sc in the next 14sts, 2sc in the next st, turn (17)
- 5. Ch 1, sc in the next st, sc2tog, sc in the next 12sts, sc2tog, turn (15)
- 6. Ch 1, sc2tog, sc in the next 6sts, sc2tog, sc in the next 4sts, 2sc in the next st, turn (14)
- 7. Ch 1, sc in the next 4sts, sc2tog, sc in the next 8sts, turn (13)
- 8. Ch 1, sc in the next 12sts, 2sc in the next st, turn (14)
- 9. Ch 1, sc in each st across, turn (14)
- 10. Ch 3, sc in the 3rd ch from the hook, sc in the next st, sc2tog, sc in the next 3sts, [sc2tog] 2 times, sc in the next 4sts, turn (12)

- 11. Ch 1, 2sc in the next st, sc in the next 3sts, sc2tog, sc in the next 3sts, sc2tog, leave the last st unworked, turn (10)
- 12. Ch 1, sc2tog, sc in the next 7sts, 2sc in the next st, turn (10)
- 13. Ch 1, sc in the next 4sts, sc2tog, sc in the next 2sts, sc2tog, turn (8)
- 14. Ch 1, sc in the next 7sts, 2sc in the next st, turn (9)
- 15. Ch 1, 2sc in the next st, sc in the next 7sts, 2sc in the next st, turn (11)
- 16. Ch 3, sc in the 3rd ch from the hook, sc in the next 2sts, [sc2tog] 2 times, sc in the next 5sts, turn (10)
- 17. Ch 1, 2sc in the next st, sc in the next 3sts, leave the remaining sts unworked, turn (5)
- 18. Ch 1, sc in each st across, turn (5)
- 19. Ch 1, 2sc in the next st, sc in the next 3sts, 2sc in the next st (7)
- 20. Fasten off, leave long tail

Tail (red w black ends)

- 1. Ch 6, sl st into 1st chain to create a loop
- 2. 6 sc
- 3. Sc around
- 4. Sc around
- 5. Sc around
- 6. Sc around
- 7. Sc around
- 8. Sc around
- 9. Sc around
- 10. Sc around
- 11. Sc around
- 12. Sc around
- 13. Sc around
- 14. Sc around
- 15. Sc around
- 16. Sl st, fasten off (this will be the "cord")
- 17. Take the black yarn and wrap it around your hand 6-8 times and cut
- 18. Bring both ends of the yarn together on one side and hold the connected end on the other side, then fold the connected end over the cut end, repeat until the cluster of yarn is double the length of how you want the actual tail to look
- 19. Pull one end of the cluster through the last row of the tail cord so that they are intersecting, there should be an even-ish amount of the yarn cluster on either side of the tail cord
- 20. Take all the loops on one end of the cluster and pull it through all the loops on the other side and tighten

- 21. Cut the loop ends you just pulled through so that they are strands instead of loops (do not cut it perpendicularly, you are not trying to shorten the tuff just separate the loops!)
- 22. Brush out the strands to create the "tuft" of fur at the end of the tail
- **23. Note**: Sorry this part is a bit confusing, if you're still lost, just follow this tutorial starting at 1:21:28 https://youtu.be/kjonvaKvRg?t=4888

Assembly and stuff

Note: it helps to pin the parts together before sewing them on!

- 1. Sew the head to the body lining up the closed off end with the opening on the narrower end of the body (it looks huge I know but trust the process)
- 2. Sew on the muzzle below row 13 parallel to the eye space, stuff bits inside the muzzle as you sew it on
 - a. If you'd like, sew a Y-shape with black thread/yarn on the muzzle to give it the nostrils
- 3. Sew on horns on top of head, for me they took up rows 3-8 on both sides but you can sew them as you wish
- 4. Sew on ears below the horns on either side
- 5. A few rows down from where the head meets the body, find the vertical center of the body's backside, place a pin, and sew wings on opposite sides of the pin (keep the pin in to keep a center point for the tail)
- 6. Sew on arms close to where the head meets the body on both sides, towards the front
- 7. Sew on the legs at the front of the doll towards the bottom rows (sit the plush down and see how it sits best without falling, pin the legs when you find where they work best to support the doll) on both sides
- 8. Using the pin from step 5 as reference, sew on the tail towards the bottom of the back
- **9. Optional**: if you'd like, you can sew on a pentagram or a pentagon on the forehead as some others have done, but that's up to u :))
- 10. Sew in/hide all ends and you should be solid!
